


Key Takeaways:

- Americans who say the government is covering up the Epstein files say they are doing so to protect the rich and powerful whose names are on the list.




Americans Continue to Hear More Negative on Trump; His Handling of the Epstein Files Dominates Across Party Lines


Over the past few days, has what you have seen, read, or heard recently about Donald Trump been:



[If hearing negative/mixed] In a few words, what negative things have you seen, read, or heard recently about Donald Trump?







Two in Three Say There Is an Epstein "Client List" the Government Is Hiding

Majorities of Democrats (78%), independents (62%), non-MAGA Republicans* (59%), and even MAGA Republicans* (55%) say the government is covering up an Epstein "client list."

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


Bipartisan Majorities Think That the Epstein "Client List" Comes With Serious Accusations and Is Not Just a Conspiracy Theory

Majorities across party lines say that "the 'client list' comes with serious accusations, and the government should take it seriously" (at least 51% across party lines, including Republicans). This includes a plurality of MAGA Republicans* (46%).

Republicans who say there is definitely a "client list" that should be taken seriously are disproportionately 18-44 years old (53%).

Majorities Say the Government Is Covering Up the "Client List," With or Without the Trump Admin Being Linked to the Cover-up


For Republicans, mention of Trump makes a difference (42% say Trump is covering it up, 58% say the government is).

[Split Sample - Trump] Regardless of how closely you've been following the situation... 

Navigator is designed to act as a consistent, flexible, responsive tool to inform policy debates by conducting research and reliable guidance to inform allies, elected leaders, and the press. Navigator is a project led by pollsters from Global Strategy Group and GBAO along with an advisory committee, including: Jessica Floyd, The Hub Project; Christina Reynolds; Mike Podhorzer; Jesse Ferguson, progressive strategist; Navin Nayak; Stephanie Valencia, EquisLabs; and Melanie Newman, Planned Parenthood Action Fund.

About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted a public opinion survey among a sample of 1,000 registered voters from July 16-July 21, 2025. 100 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among younger voters between ages 18 and 27. 100 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables. The margin of error for the full sample at the 95 percent level of confidence is +/- 3.1 percentage points. The margin of error for subgroups varies and is higher.
