
### **Key Takeaways:**

- Nearly three in five Americans report hearing "a lot" about Trump's use of tariffs, as tariffs broadly and his plan specifically remain deeply unpopular.




## In the Face of Changing Trade Deals, Trump's Tariffs Remain Deeply Unpopular



### Majorities Continue to Say Trump's Tariffs Are Sending Their Costs Up

Nearly two in three independents (65%) say Trump's tariff policy is making their costs go up, as do more than three in five non-MAGA Republicans\* (62%) and roughly half of Republicans overall (49%).



## Majorities Still Say Trump's Tariffs Are Causing Chaos, Not Causing Other Countries to Negotiate

A growing majority of independents (56%) say Trump's tariff policy is creating chaos, as do a third of non-MAGA Republicans\* (33%).




## Half of Americans Continue to Oppose Republicans' Budget Plan, and Majorities View It Unfavorably

A majority of independents (52%) oppose the budget plan recently passed by Trump and Republicans, and negativity among non-MAGA Republicans\* has increased since July (from net +15 favorable to net 0).

### Republicans Raising Costs and Cutting Important Programs Are Equally Concerning


Independents are more concerned about Republicans raising costs (net +40 more concerned) than making cuts (net +30). Americans who earn less than \$50,000 a year are also more concerned about Republicans raising costs (net +36) than making cuts (net +23).


#### Which concerns you more?

**Democrats** who are spending too much money on government handouts and wasting taxpayer dollars.

[Split Sample – COSTS] Republicans who are raising costs by imposing massive new tariffs on everyday essentials like groceries, clothing, and cars, and passing new budgets that drive up prices on health insurance and utility bills.

[Split Sample – CUTS] Republicans who are taking away things working families count on, including making the largest cut to Medicaid in history, eliminating health care for more than 10 million people, and taking food away from kids and families.







## **Even With Lower Numbers for Trump on Tariffs, Republicans Are Still More Trusted on Trade Policy**

When forced to choose which party they trust more on trade policy and tariffs, independents are split (net +1 trust Democrats), though when they are allowed to indicate that they don't trust either party, a plurality (37%) choose that option.

## On the Issues: Tariffs, Inflation, and Immigration/Deportations Are Raising the Most Concerns for Americans on Trump

Inflation is the top Trump-related concern among Republicans (39% top four), driven especially by non-MAGA Republicans\* (45%).

#### **About Navigator**

In a world where the news cycle is the length of a tweet, our leaders often lack the real-time public-sentiment analysis to shape the best approaches to talking about the issues that matter the most. Navigator is designed to act as a consistent, flexible, responsive tool to inform policy debates by conducting research and reliable guidance to inform allies, elected leaders, and the press. Navigator is a project led by pollsters from Global Strategy Group and GBAO along with an advisory committee, including: Jessica Floyd, The Hub Project; Christina Reynolds; Mike Podhorzer; Jesse Ferguson, progressive strategist; Navin Nayak; Stephanie Valencia, EquisLabs; and Melanie Newman, Planned Parenthood Action Fund.

#### About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted a public opinion survey among a sample of 1,000 registered voters from August 7-August 11, 2025. 100 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among Asian American and Pacific Islander voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables. The margin of error for the full sample at the 95 percent level of confidence is +/- 3.1 percentage points. The margin of error for subgroups varies and is higher.
