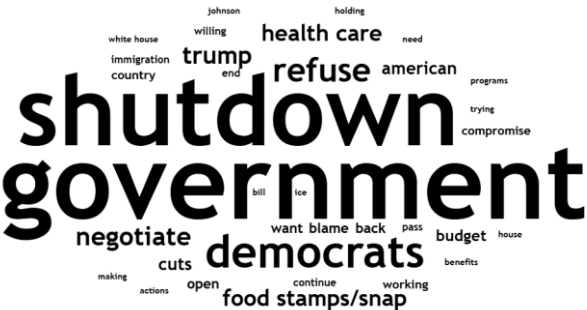

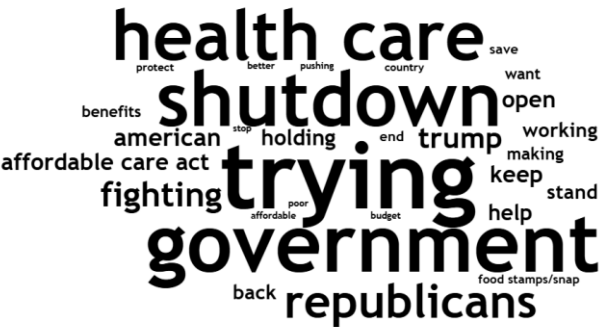

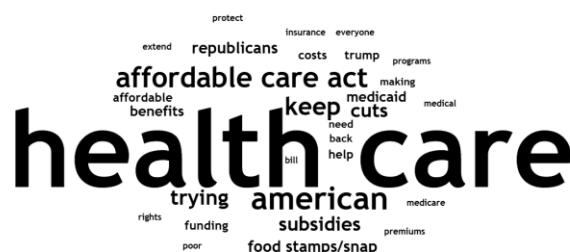

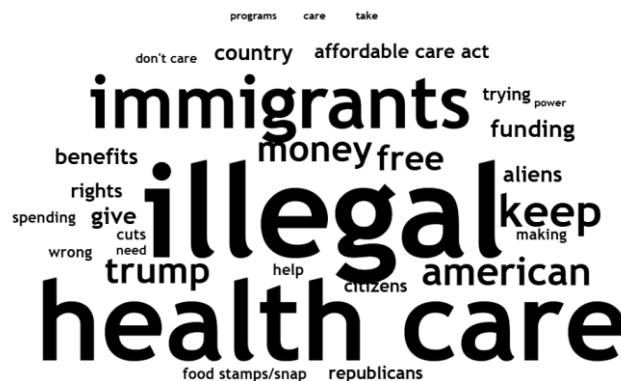

Q4. [IF A POSITIVE IMPRESSION] And what, specifically, do you think Democrats in Congress are fighting for in this government shutdown?



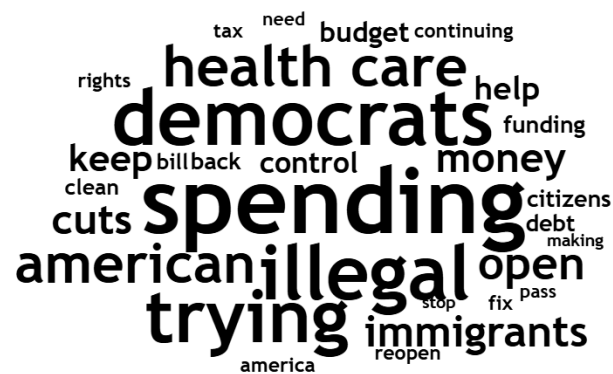
Q4. [IF A NEGATIVE IMPRESSION] And what, specifically, do you think Democrats in Congress are fighting for in this government shutdown?



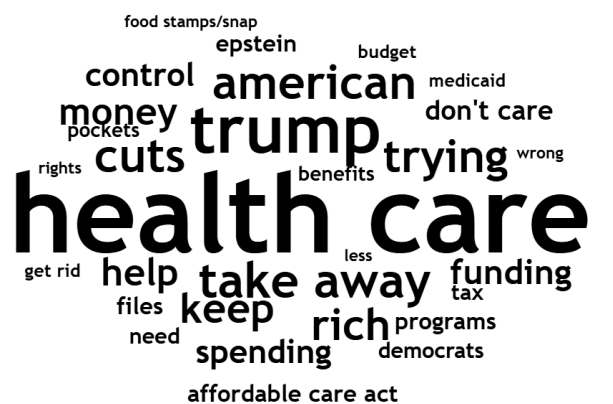
Q5A. [SPLIT A] Do you have a positive or negative impression of what Republicans in Congress are fighting for in this government shutdown?

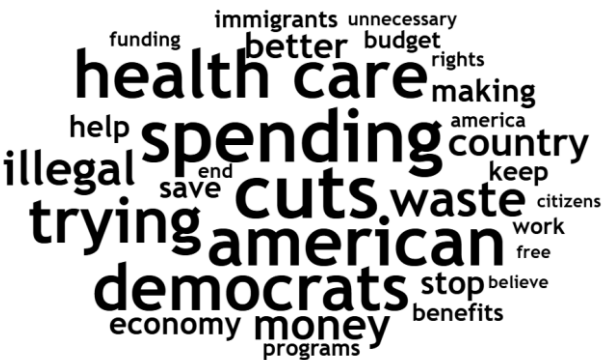

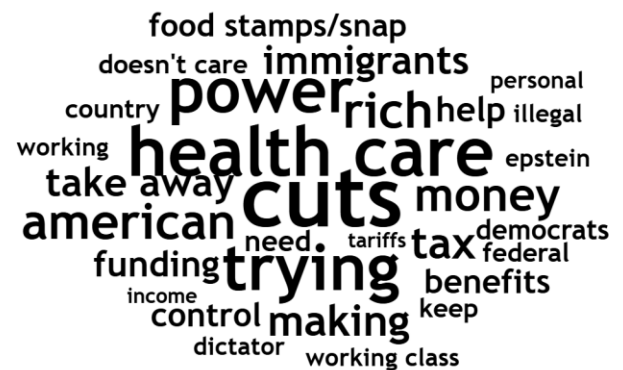
