# Key takeaways:

- A key group of Americans those who disapprove of Trump overall, but approve of him on the economy – strongly disapprove of how Trump is handling the pandemic.
- Americans are nostalgic for the pre-crisis economy, but feel Trump is not doing enough to help regular people, and that his mistakes have made the economy worse.
- Most Americans support measures allowing "safe voting."




## Trump's Approvals Remain Underwater; Public More Split on Economic Handling

Trump's approval ratings on four metrics related to the coronavirus pandemic continue to drop.

Among independents, Trump's at -29 on his overall job approval (31% approve/60% disapprove), -29 on health care (25% approve/54% disapprove), -11 on handling the pandemic (36% approve/47% disapprove), and -1 on the economy (44% approve/45% disapprove).

#### Do you approve or disapprove of the way that Donald Trump is handling...





## Profiling "Conflicted" Americans Who Approve of Trump on Economy, But Not Overall

Using 7,000+ interviews conducted over the last month, we again looked at "<u>Conflicted</u>" Americans – 7% of the public who disapprove of Trump overall, but approve of his economic handling.

 This is a key group of the public who hold mixed partisan attitudes – 36% voted for Clinton in 2016, 34% voted for Trump, 10% voted 3<sup>rd</sup> party, and 21% didn't vote. At the same time, nearly half (48%) identify as moderate.



"Conflicted" are those who disapprove of Trump overall, but approve of him on the economy. "Loyalists" are those who approve of Trump overall and approve of him on the economy. ### **Democrats More Trusted on Responding to Economic Impact**

Democrats in Congress hold an advantage over Trump on trust to respond to the economic impact of the coronavirus pandemic and to make decisions about when and how to reopen the country.

While independents trust Democrats somewhat more on looking out for working people (+6), they are split on who to trust to be honest with the public (+1) and responding to the economic impact of the pandemic (-3).



Roughly half say the economy was working before the crisis. Half also find Trump's economic message to be a convincing reason why he is prepared to handle the recovery.




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
## ...But Majority Agree Trump Isn't Doing Enough to Help Regular People & Made Mistakes That Hurt the Economy




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## Voters More Concerned About Trump Prolonging Economic Crisis Than Economic Damage Done So Far

When presented with a series of criticisms about Trump's approach to the economic recovery, early mistakes, ignoring economists who say more government action is needed, and corporate bailouts raise the most serious concerns.



#### Please indicate how favorable or unfavorable you are to the United States Postal Service.




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# **Broad Support For Expanding Voting Access**

Despite narratives of voter fraud and other unproven criticisms of expanding voting access, more than two in three Americans support allowing people to vote at different times at polls in-person, funding the USPS to ensure mail-in ballots have no issues, making Election Day a national holiday, and other measures.




# **Trump Threats on Vote By Mail Fall Flat**

Most Americans oppose Trump's threat to withhold federal funding to states that expand mail voting.

• Even among Republicans, support for Trump's position is only at 56%. Among Republicans who watch Fox News, it's at 66%.

As you may know, Donald Trump has claimed that voting by mail promotes "voter fraud" and he threatened to withhold federal election funding from states like Nevada and Michigan, who say they are considering expanding mail voting options to allow residents to vote safely despite the coronavirus pandemic.

# "Safe Voting" More Compelling than "Voter Reforms"



#### About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted a public opinion survey among a sample of 1,012 registered voters conducted May 21-May 25, 2020. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from multiple opt-in online panel vendors. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables.
