Communicating in Crisis: Coronavirus

Key takeaways:

- Trump's rating on handling the pandemic has reached a new low point.

- Americans are especially concerned by Trump blocking CDC guidelines on how to safely reopen the country.




Trump Approval on Pandemic Hits New Low

Trump's approval rating on his handling of the pandemic has reached its lowest point in our daily tracking.

- 45% of Americans now say they "strongly disapprove" of Trump's handling, the highest yet.
- Among independents, Trump is at -34 on his handling of the pandemic (28% approve/62% disapprove).




Majority Call Trump's Response a Failure

A majority of Americans say that Trump's response to the pandemic has been a failure.

- A third say Trump's response has been a "big failure," while just 8% say it has been a "big success."
- Even among Republicans, while 74% call it a success, only 16% say that it has been a "big success."

Top Concerns: Downplaying, Ignoring Experts, Risking Lives

When presented with a series of criticisms about Trump's handling of the coronavirus pandemic, respondents rate early downplaying, ignoring experts, and blaming others as actions that raise the most serious concerns.

• "Very" serious concern about early downplaying grew 8 points from March 23 (42% to 50%).



Trump Not Taking Responsibility More Concerning Than Distractions

Americans are more concerned that Trump too often blames others and fails to take responsibility during the crisis than being too distracted by petty political fights.

 More than half (52%) of Americans who are mixed on Trump, and 56% of independents, are more concerned that Trump too often blames others.

Top concerns include comments about injecting disinfectants, ignoring intelligence briefings, and blocking CDC guidelines on reopening, while Trump getting daily testing during a shortage ranks lowest.

About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted a public opinion survey among a sample of 1,010 registered voters conducted May 8-May 13, 2020. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from multiple opt-in online panel vendors. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables.
