What we did

The slides in this presentation refer to findings from online interviews of 1,002 registered voters, conducted from November 6th to November 8th, 2020.

The results among self-reported 2020 voters have been adjusted to reflect a preliminary estimate (as of November 9th) of the final, national popular vote shares received by Joe Biden and Donald Trump. These results provide an initial window into the way 2020 voters, including those who participated in the recent election, are experiencing news about the election's outcome.



Key takeaways:


- Nearly four in five say that Biden is winning the election, including a majority of Trump voters.
- Confidence that ballots will be counted accurately and fairly has declined among Trump voters.
- Trump remains underwater on approval of his response to the election results, while almost two in three approve of Biden's response.

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A Resounding Majority Now Say Biden Is Winning the Election

While 65% of Americans said Biden was winning before noon on November 7th before the *Associated Press* and others began to call the election for him, 74% said the same in interviews conducted after.

Nationwide survey of 1,002 registered voters conducted Nov. 6-8, 2020. Vote shares for Biden and Trump among self-reported 2020 voters are adjusted to reflect preliminary estimates of the national popular vote.



Americans Increasingly Report Biden Has Won the Election

Americans report hearing a range of things from news coverage of the election, including most dominantly that Joe Biden has won the election and that Donald Trump is pushing back against the election results.

• On a separate question, 77% of Americans say they are following coverage of the election "very closely" or "somewhat closely," including 90% of Biden voters and 72% of Trump voters.





While Most Remain Confident in Election, Decline in Confidence Among Trump Voters

Among Trump voters since November 5th, there has been a 15-point decrease in confidence that the results will be counted correctly and fairly, and a 16-point decrease in confidence regarding the counting of their own ballot.

How confident are you that your ballot in the November presidential election will be counted correctly and fairly?









Concern About Voter Fraud Rises Among Trump Voters as Voting Concerns Fall Among Biden Voters

Two in five now say they are more concerned about vote fraud, while just three in ten say they are more concerned about voter suppression.

• Among Biden voters, there has been a 19-point increase in the share who are not concerned about either voter suppression or voter fraud since November 5th (from 29% to 48%).

Thinking about the ongoing counting of election results, which concerns you more?








Approval of Biden's Response to Election Results Rises While Ratings of Trump's Response Remain Deeply Negative


Three in five continue to disapprove of Donald Trump's response to the election results, while nearly two in three approve of Joe Biden's response.

• Three in ten Trump voters (29%) approve of Biden's response to the election results.

Do you approve or disapprove of the way Donald Trump has responded to the election results?


Do you approve or disapprove of the way Joe Biden has responded to the election results?







Americans Believe Trump "Just Wants to Win," While Most See Biden as Wanting an "Honest and Accurate Count"






Americans Increasingly Say It Is Time for Trump to Concede

In interviews conducted before noon on November 7th, just a third (33%) said Trump should have conceded; after, more than half (51%) said he should concede.

Do you think Donald Trump should concede the election right now?



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


Four in Five Biden Voters Say We Will Know Results Within Next Week; Declining Share of Trump Voters Agree

There was an 11-point increase in the share of Biden voters who said we would know within the next week before the race was called (75%) compared to after (86%).

• Among Trump voters, there was a 5-point decrease (from 48% to 43%).

About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted an online survey of 1,002 registered voters from November 6-8, 2020, with respondents recruited from opt-in online panel vendors. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of the sample reflected that of the national registered voter population. The vote shares for Joe Biden and Donald Trump among self-reported 2020 voters were also adjusted to reflect a preliminary estimate of the national popular vote in the 2020 presidential election.

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
