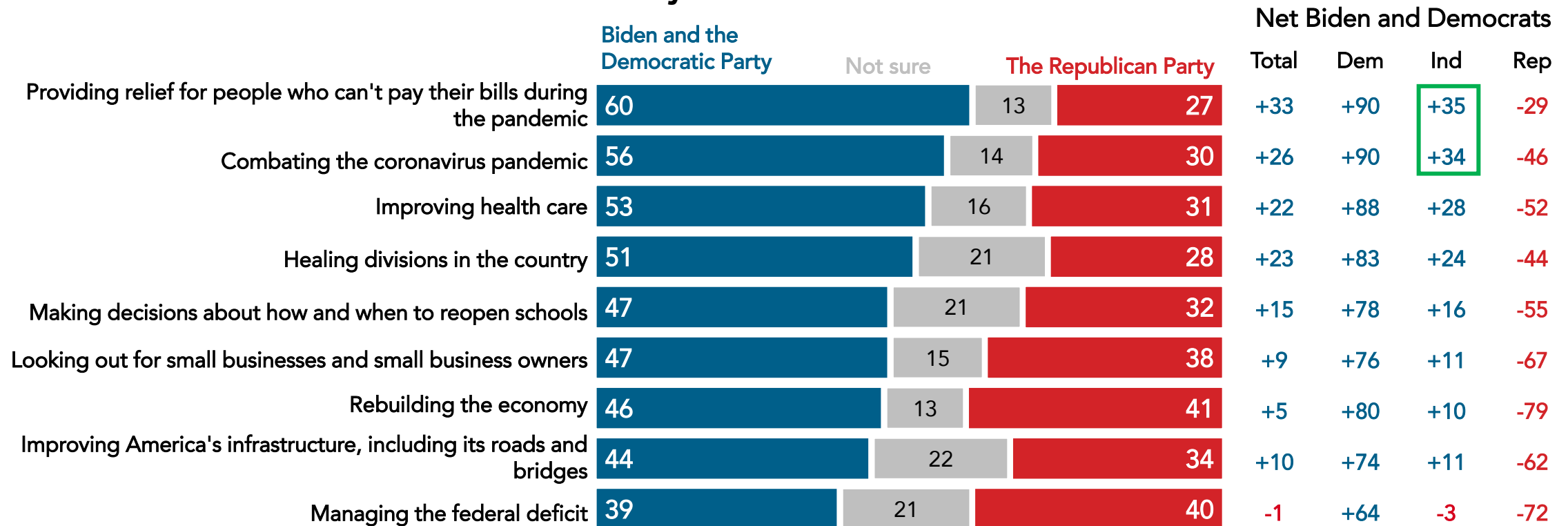

Biden and Democrats Are More Trusted on a Range of Issues from Economic Relief to the Pandemic to Health Care

Independents trust Biden and the Democratic Party more than the Republican Party on nearly all issues by double-digit margins, including by 35 points on providing pandemic relief and 34 points on combating the pandemic.

Which of these issues do you feel President Joe Biden and Congress are most focused on?

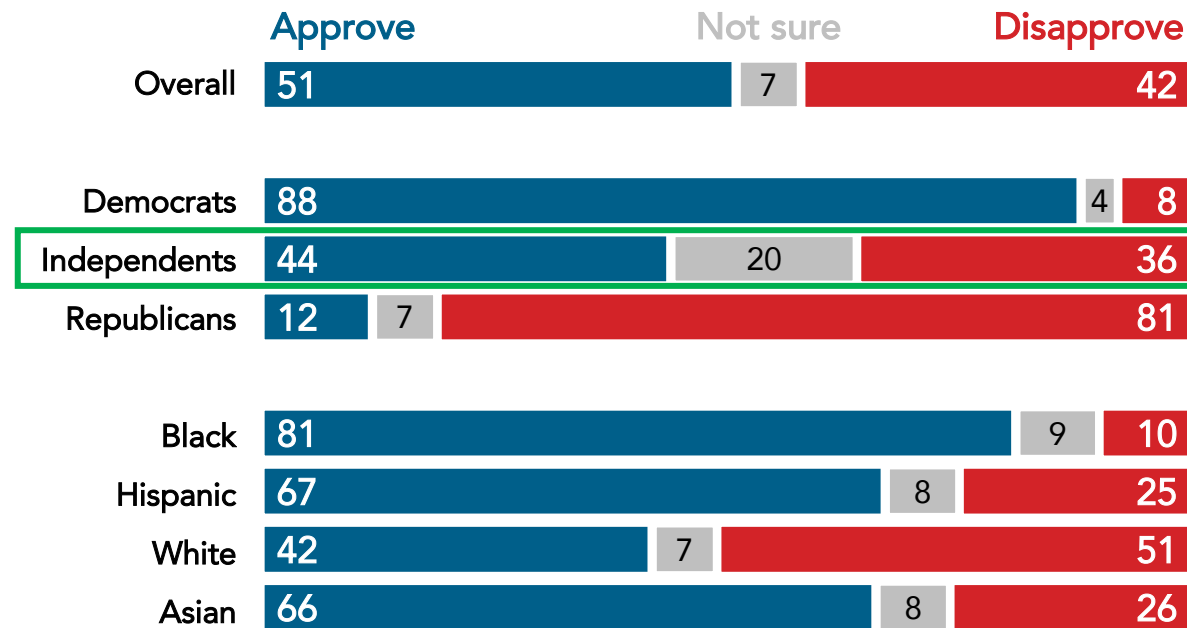

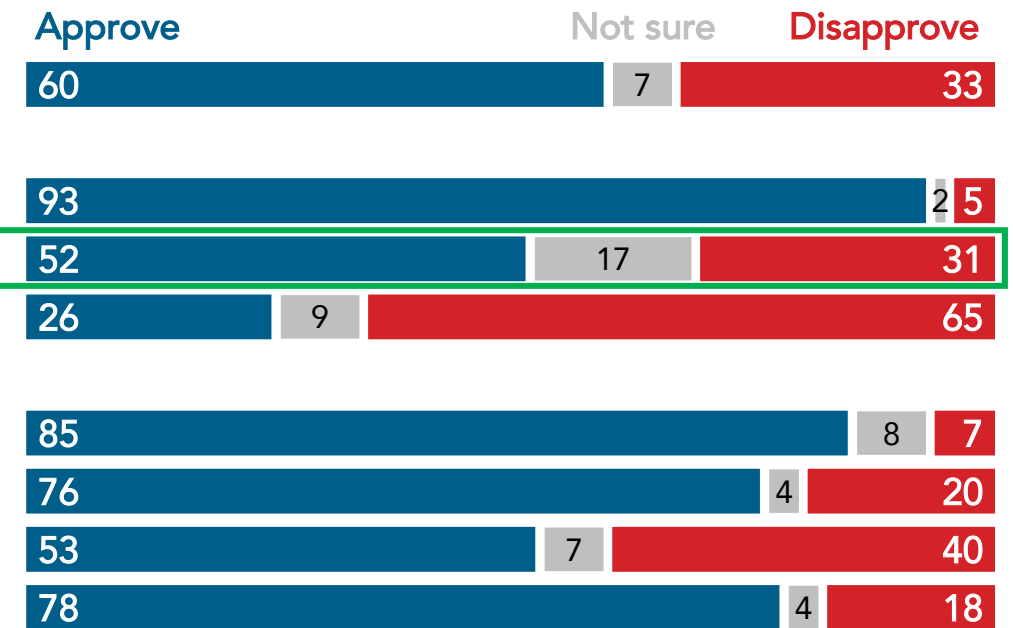
Majorities Approve of Biden on Handling of the Economy and the Pandemic

Do you approve or disapprove of the way Joe Biden is handling the coronavirus pandemic?

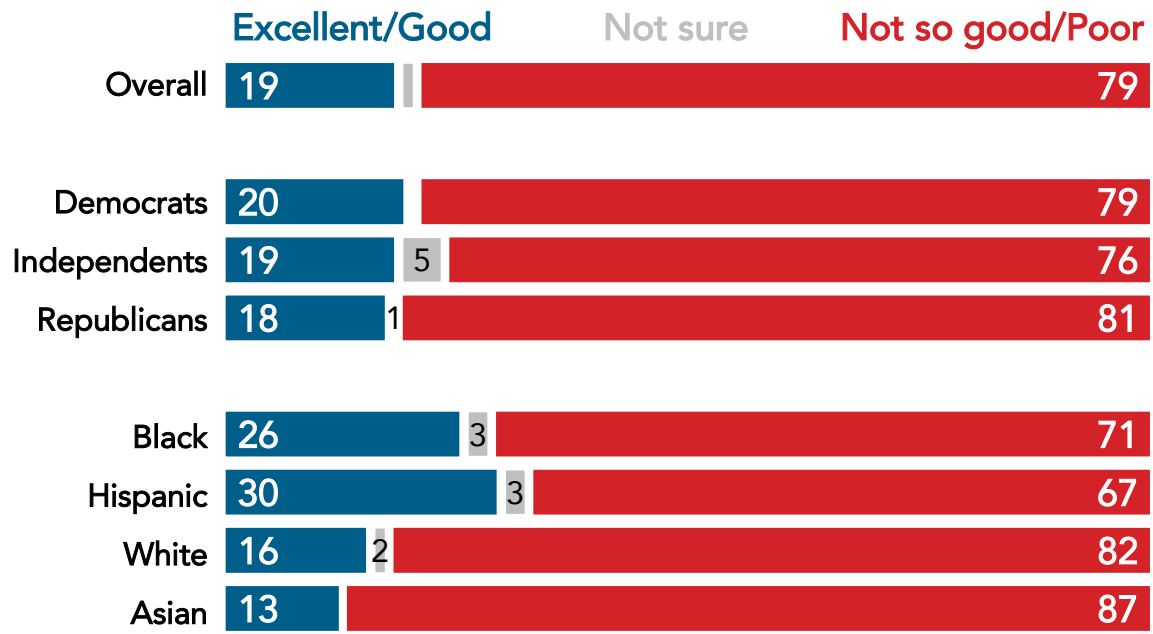

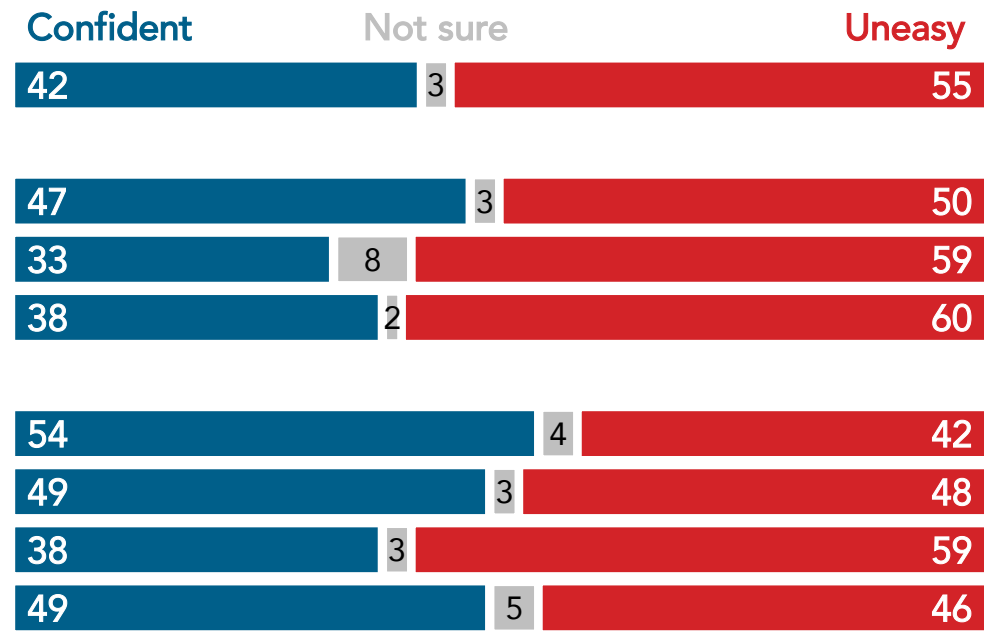
Four in Five Say Economy is “Not So Good” or “Poor” and Majority Are Financially “Uneasy”

Thinking about your personal financial situation over the next few months, do you feel confident or uneasy?

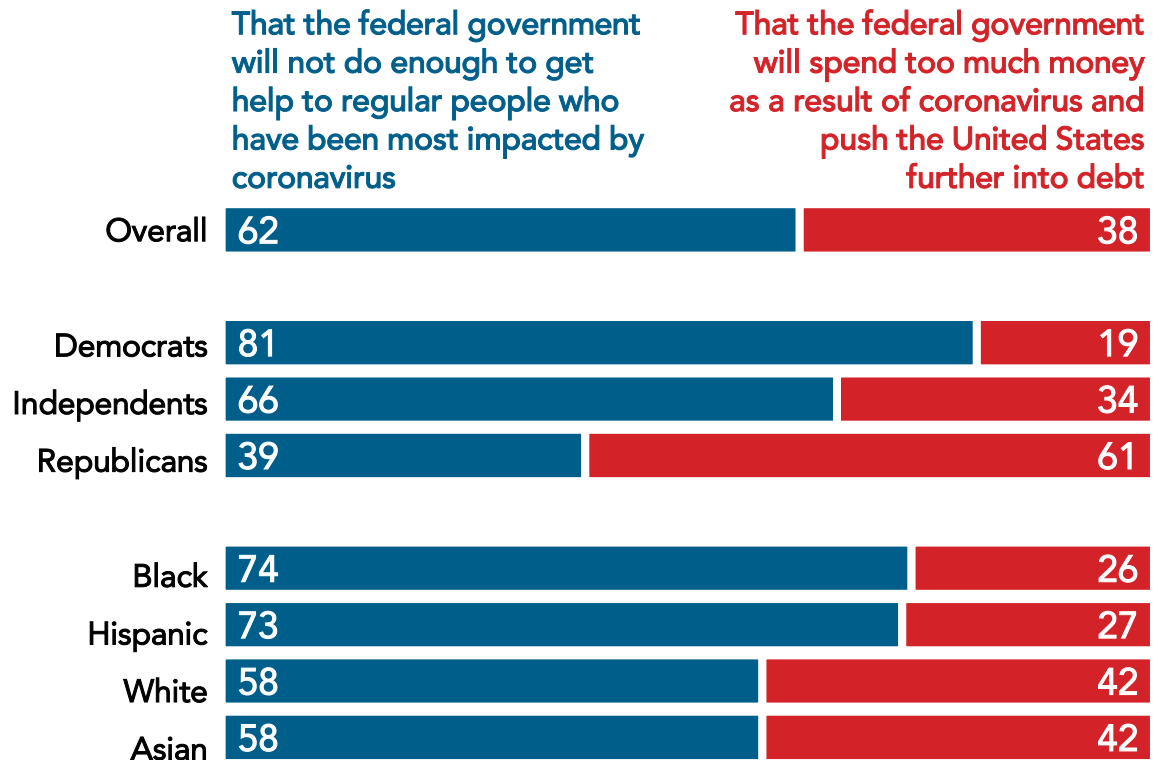

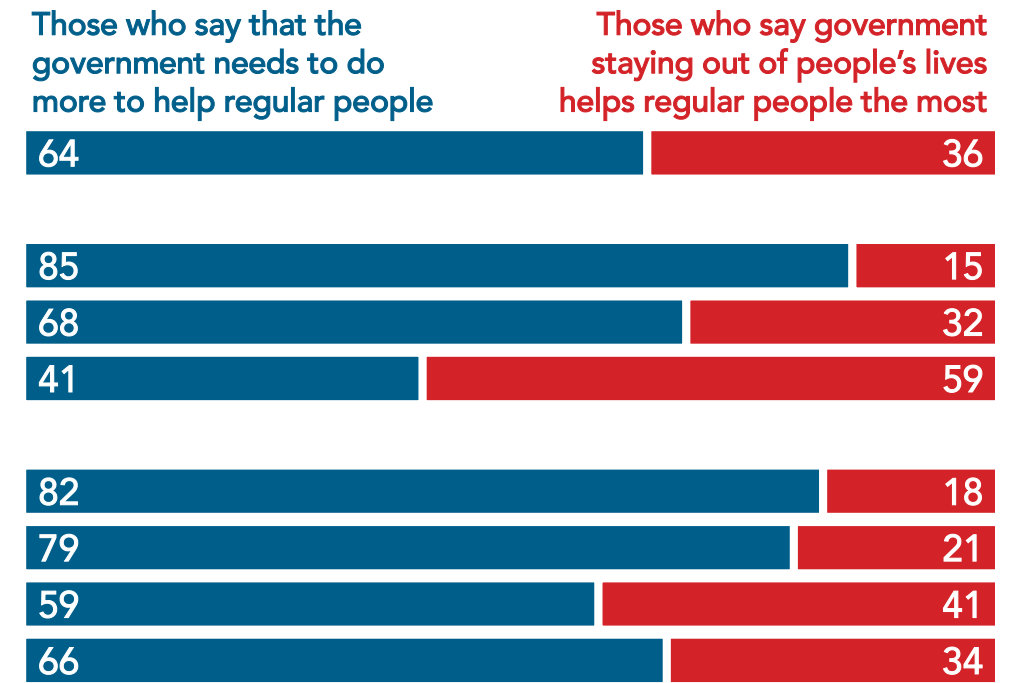
Americans Continue to Prefer the Government Do More To Help Americans Financially Rather Than Less

Even if you don't agree with either side completely, who do you agree with more?

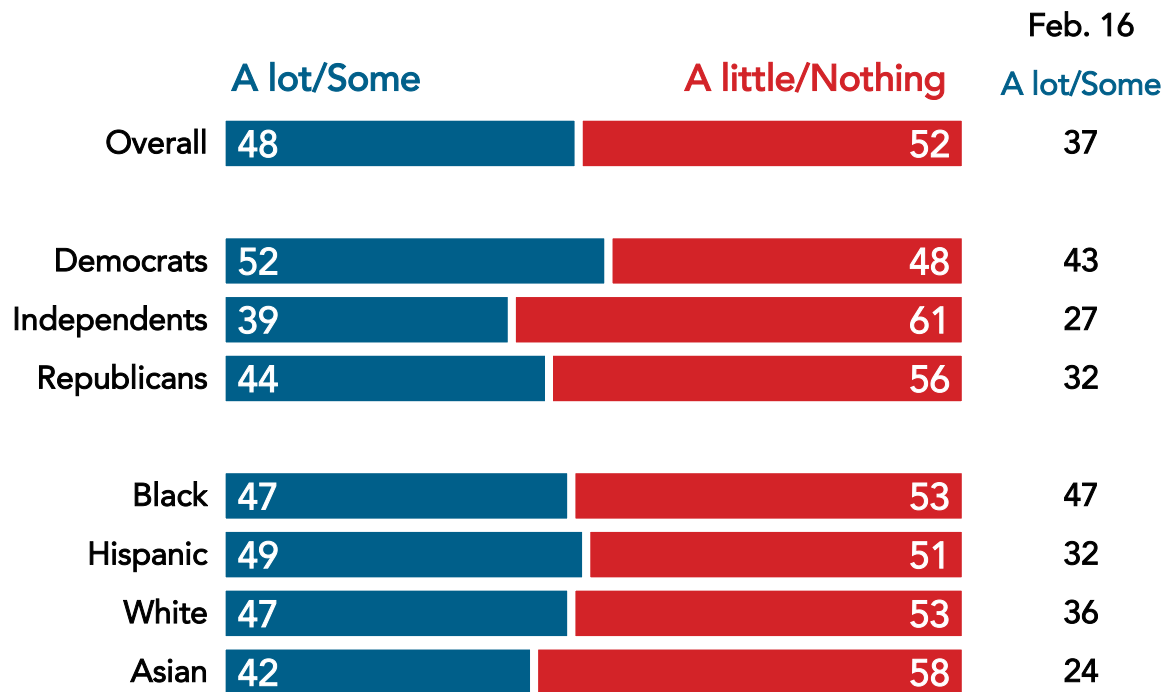

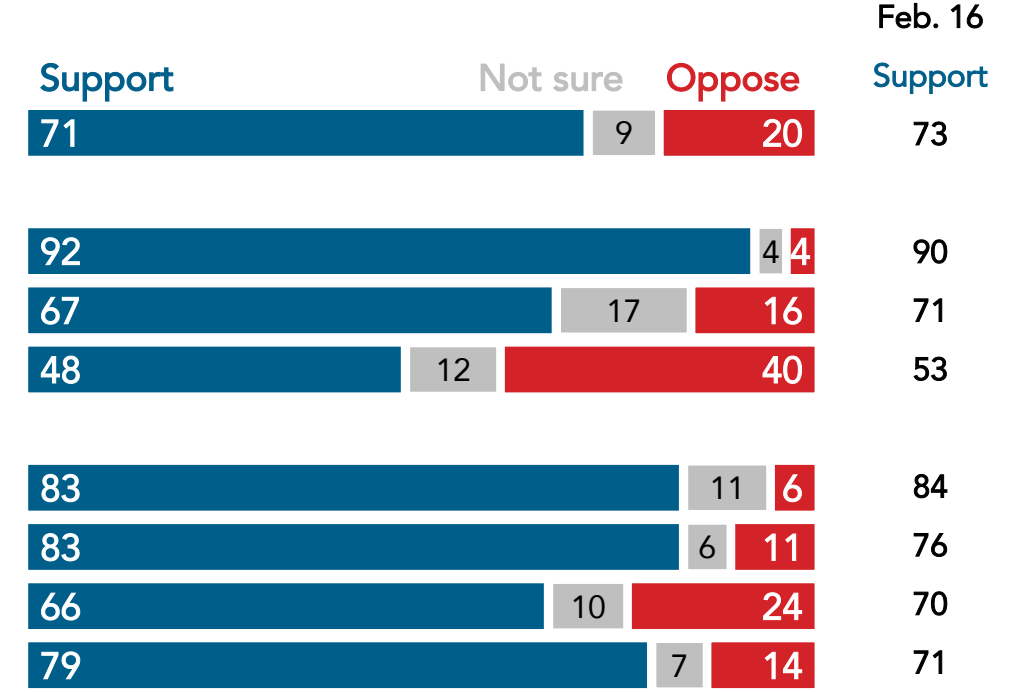
As More Hear About Biden Rescue Plan, Support Stays High

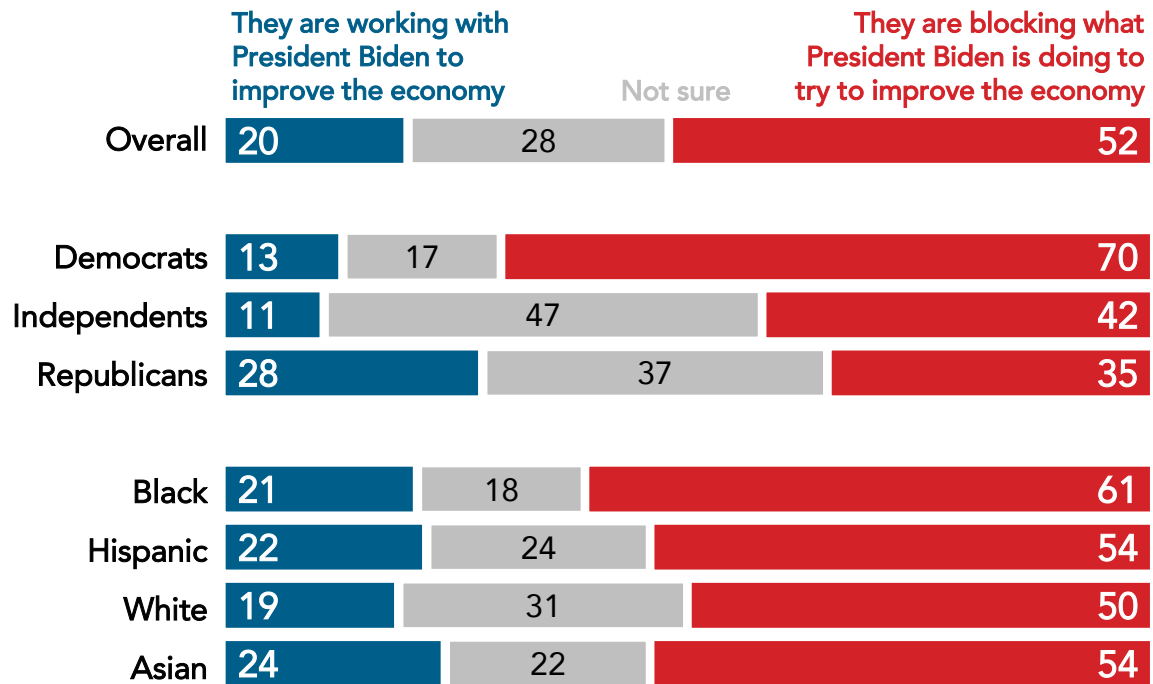

Republicans in Congress Are Seen as Blocking Biden's Efforts to Improve the Economy and Combat the Pandemic

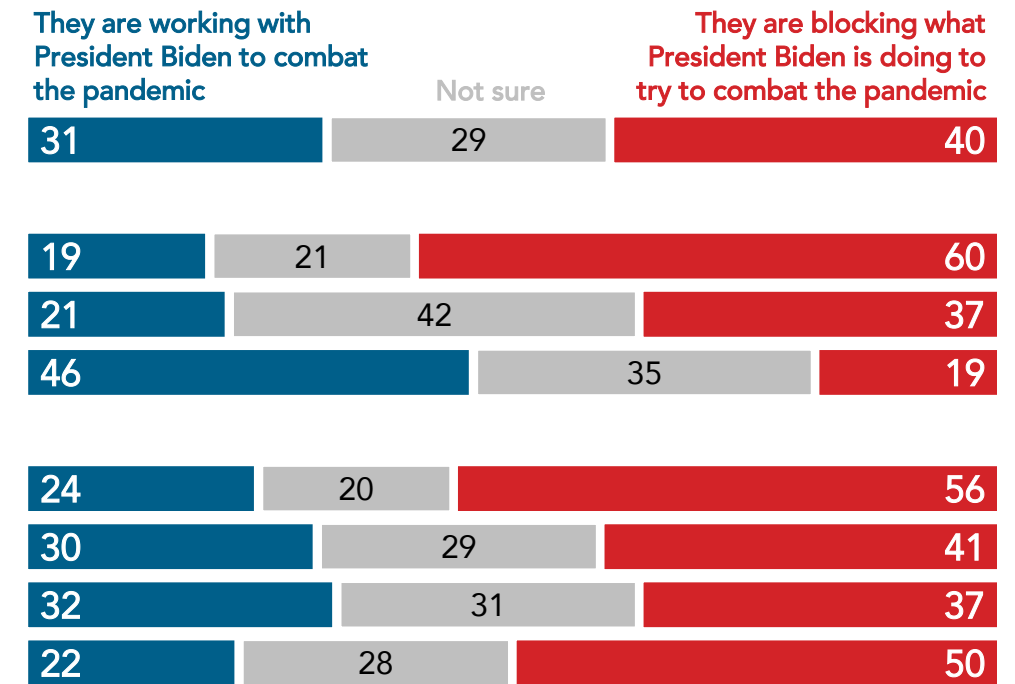
Pluralities believe Republicans in Congress are blocking what Biden is doing to improve the economy and pandemic.

When it comes to combating the coronavirus pandemic, which better describes what the Republicans in Congress are doing?

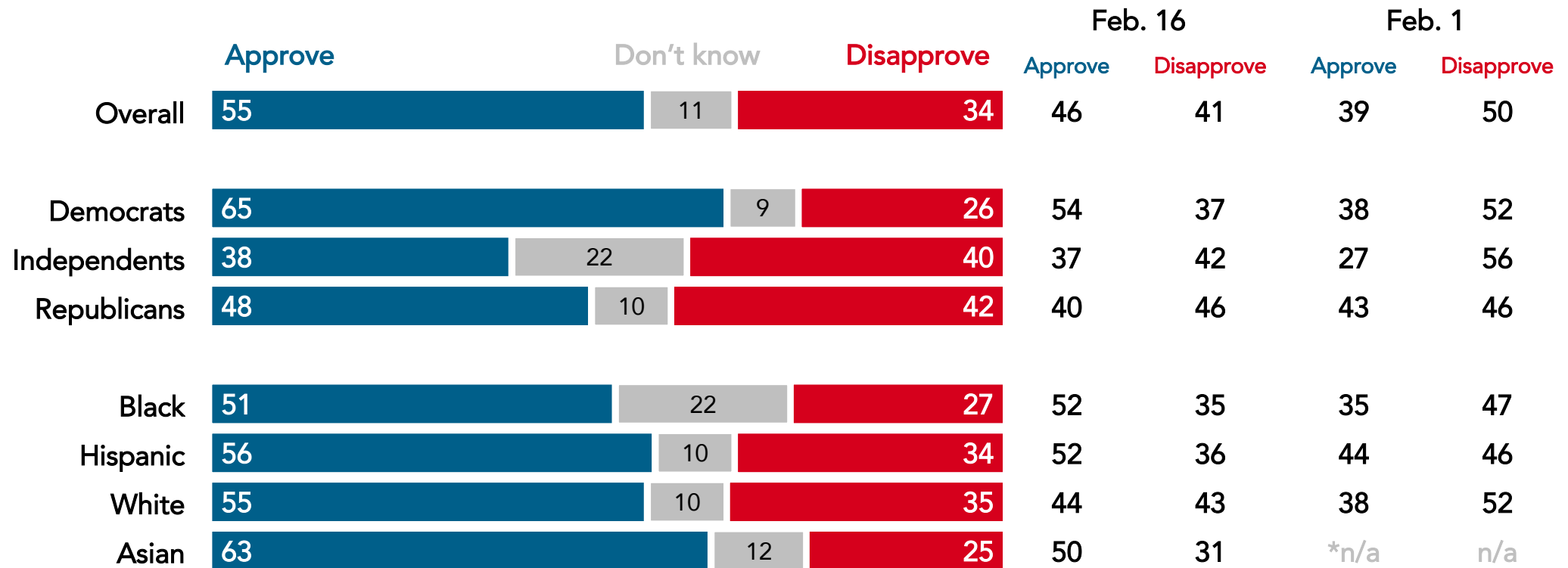

In the Last Month, Approval of the Vaccine Rollout Has Increased By 16 Points

Do you approve or disapprove of how the vaccine rollout in the United States has gone so far?

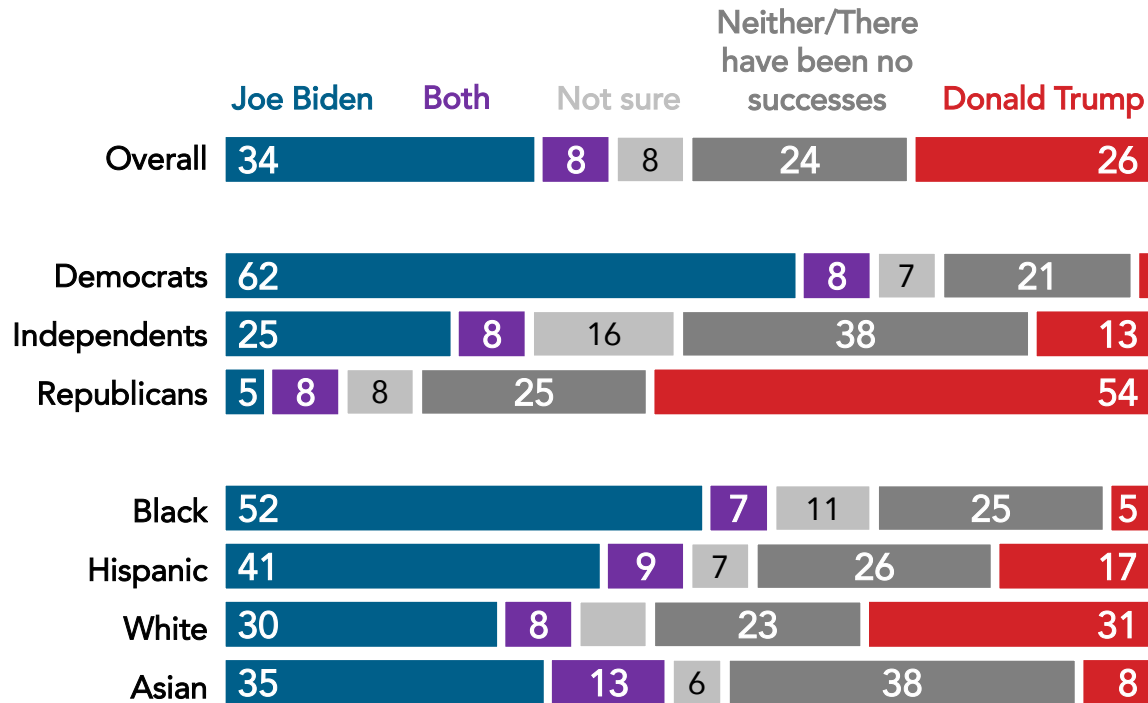

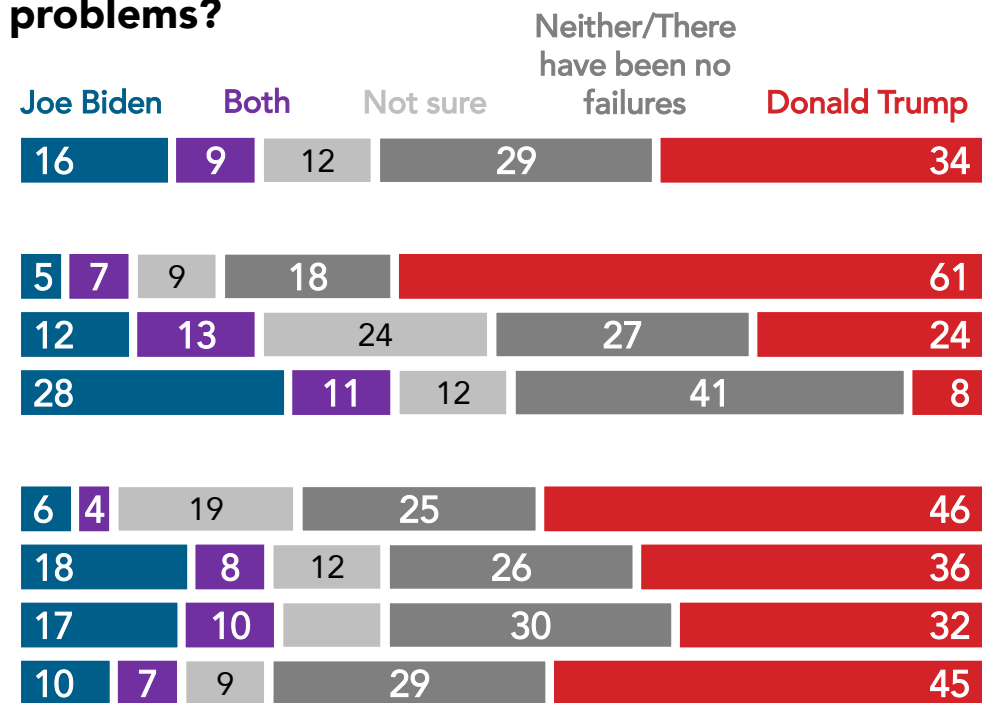
Pluralities Credit Biden With Vaccine Rollout Successes and Blame Trump for Vaccine Rollout Failures

Thinking about any problems or troubles with the vaccine rollout, who do you blame for the problems?



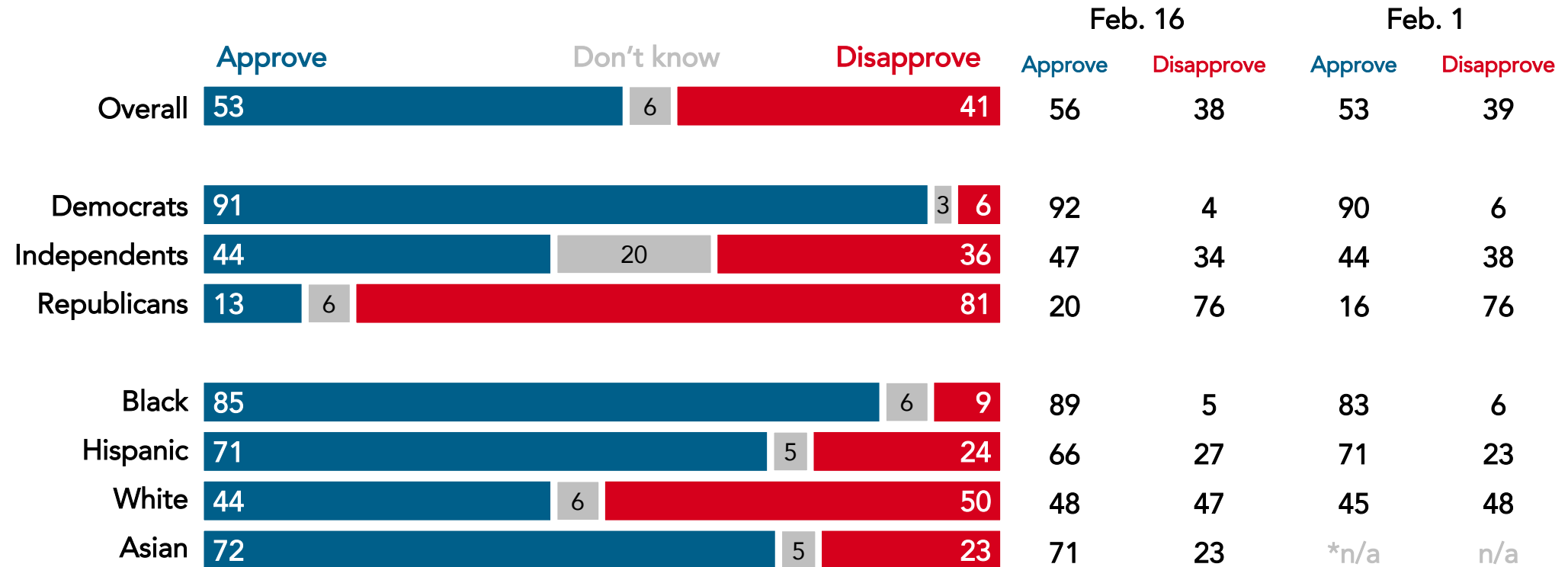

About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted public opinion surveys among a sample of 1,007 registered voters from February 25-March 1, 2021. 100 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 72 additional interviews were conducted among Asian American and Pacific Islander voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among African American voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables.
