## About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted public opinion surveys among a sample of 1,000 registered voters from May 6May 10, 2021. 99 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 96 additional interviews were conducted among Asian American and Pacific Islander voters. 102 additional interviews were conducted among African American voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables.
