

- As vaccination rates begin to plateau, approval of the vaccine rollout remains steady and high.




# Biden's Ratings on His Handling of His Job as President, the Pandemic, and the Economy All Remain Positive

Biden's approval ratings are at +31 on the pandemic, +11 overall, and +6 on the economy.

- The coronavirus pandemic






## Biden and the Democratic Party Are Viewed Favorably Overall While Trump and Republicans Are Underwater

While Biden is at net -7 (42% favorable/49% unfavorable) among independents, Trump is at -23 (36% fav/59% unfav) and the Republican Party is at net -48 (20% fav/68% unfav).

### Infrastructure and Pandemic Handling Dominating Positive Discussion of Biden


Nine in ten Democrats (90%), 58% of independents, and 45% of Republicans report hearing "mostly positive" or a "mix of positive and negative" on Biden.



Below is a list of issues. Please indicate who you trust more to handle:






# As Reported Vaccination Rates Stabilize, Vaccine Rollout Approval Remains Steady and High


Since April, at least nine in ten Americans have reported knowing someone who has been vaccinated as approval of the rollout has stayed around 70%. In the last month, roughly 60% have consistently reported being personally vaccinated.

### About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted public opinion surveys among a sample of 1,000 registered voters from June 24-June 28, 2021. 100 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 71 additional interviews were conducted among Asian American and Pacific Islander voters. 101 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables.
