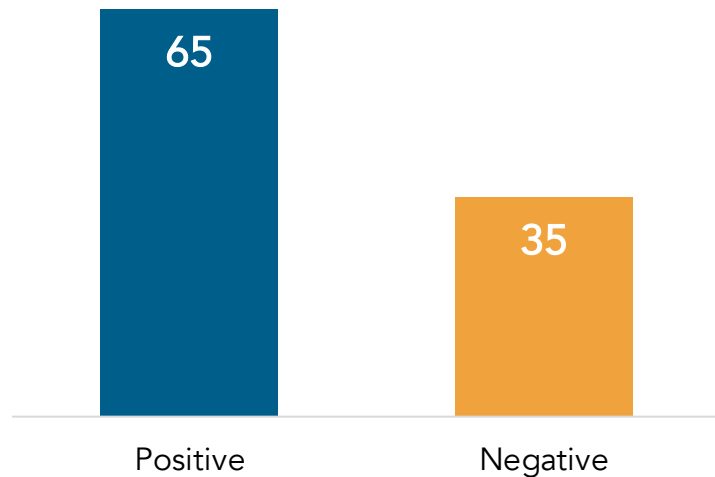

What stood out most to you about Biden's speech tonight?

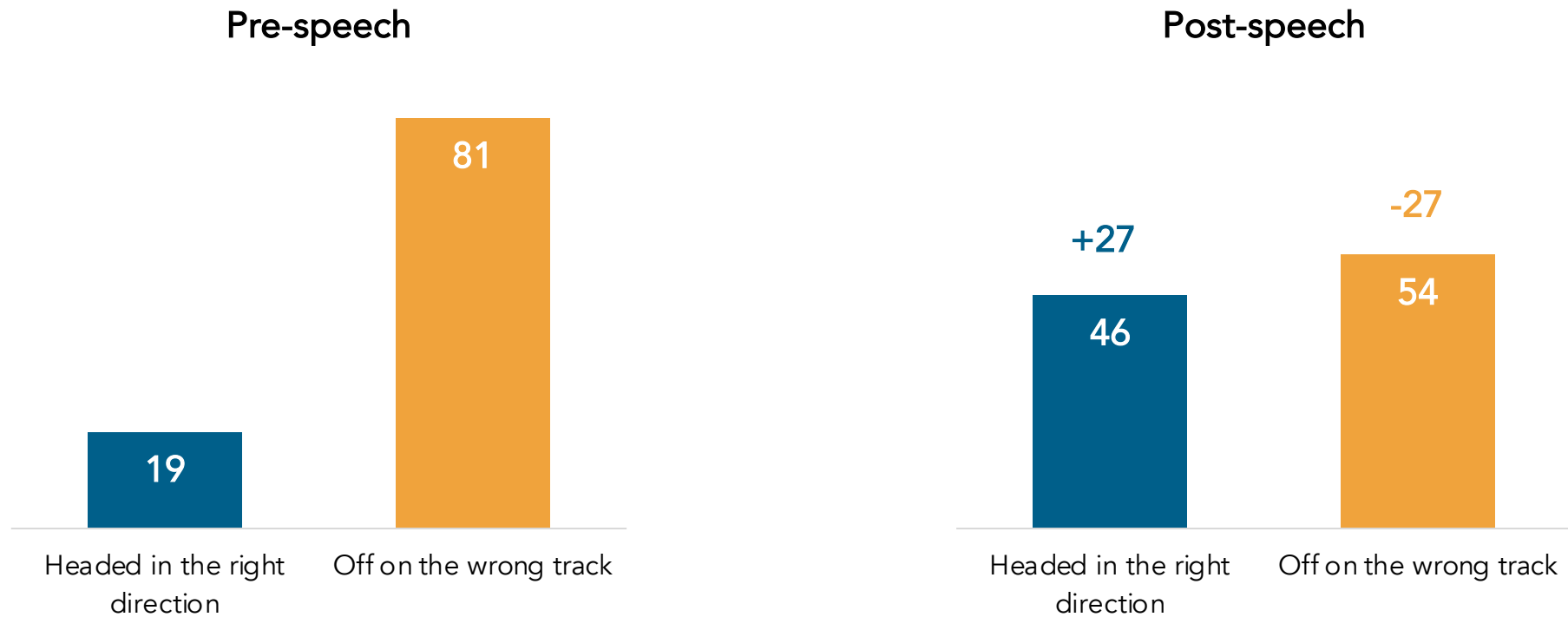
"I thought that Biden was very direct. He show strength and willingness to get things done."

The Speech Made Participants More Optimistic Of America's Future

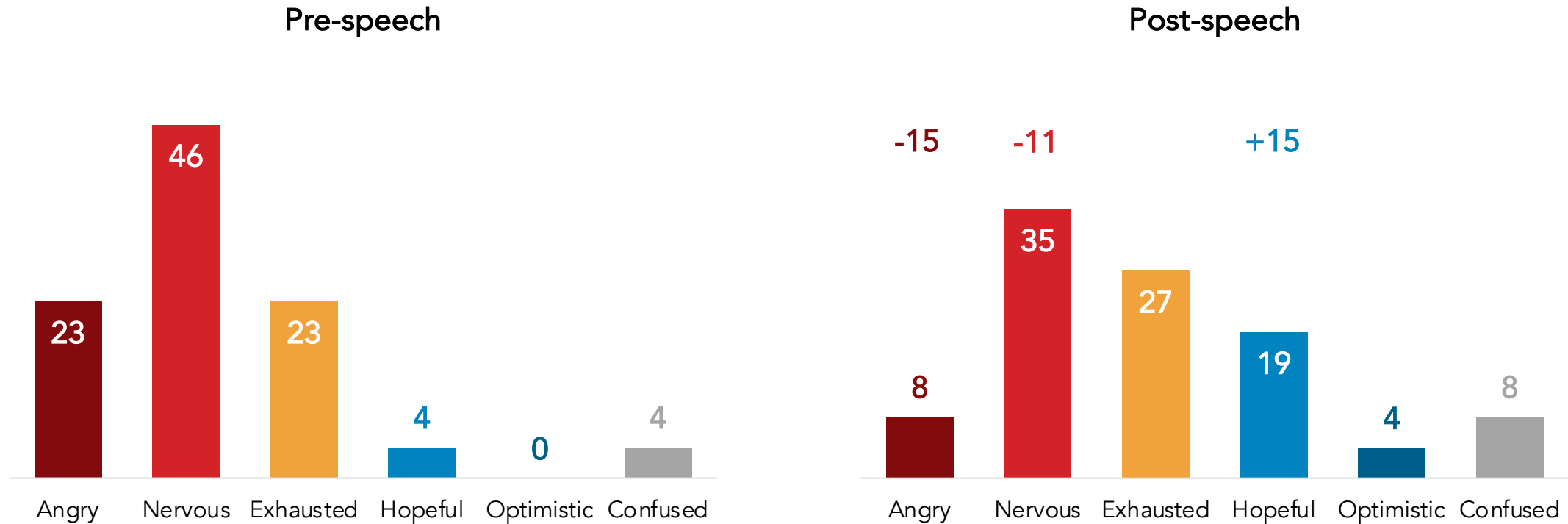
Generally speaking, would you say the country is...?

Post-Speech Fewer Are Angry And More Are Hopeful

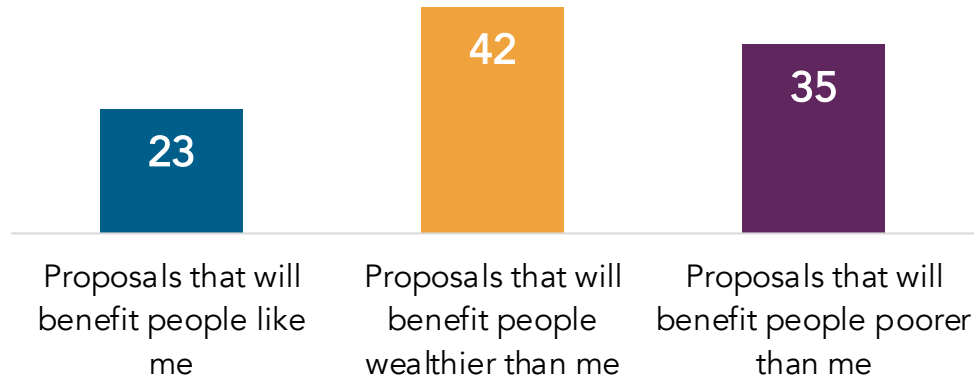
Which best describes how you feel about how things are going in the country?



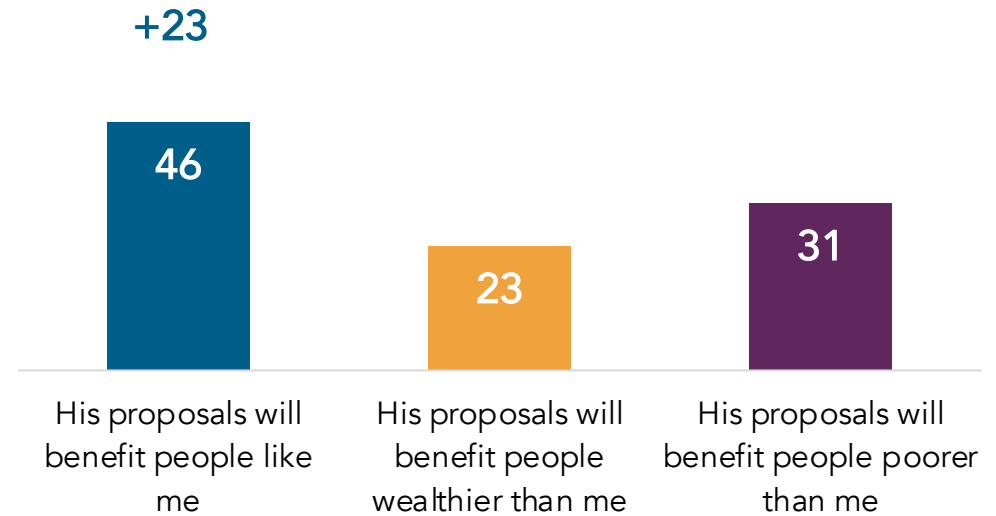

PRE-SPEECH: Which do you expect more about in tonight's speech?



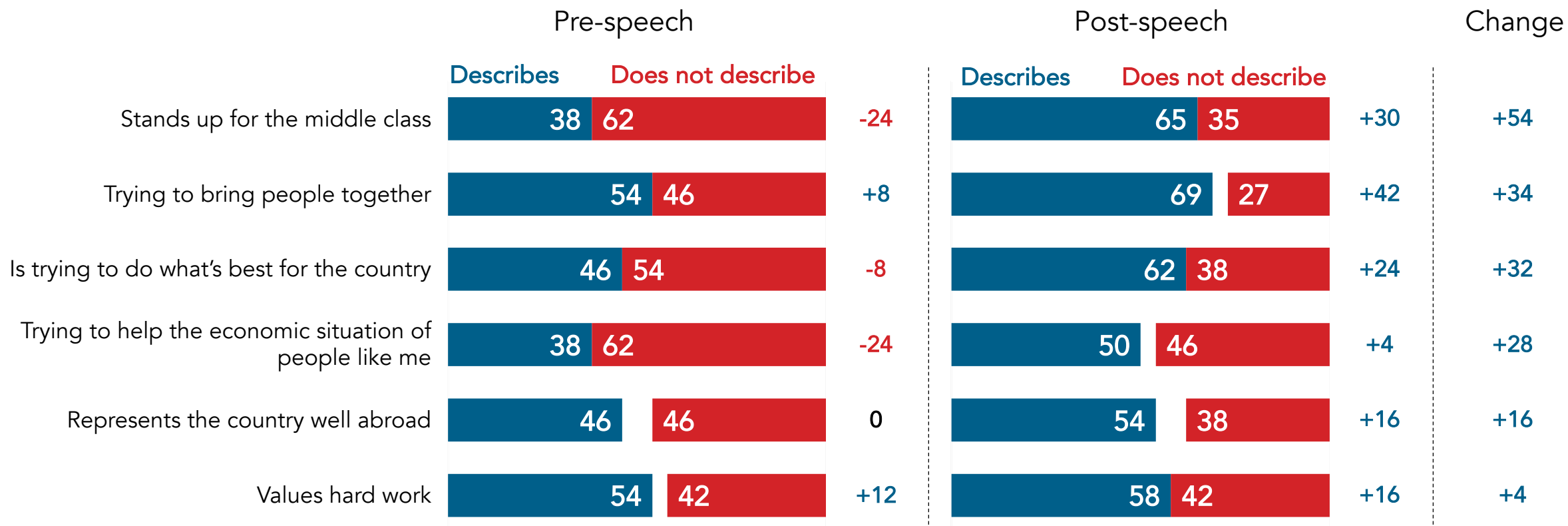
POST-SPEECH: Which of the following comes closer to what you think about the policy proposals Biden discussed tonight?

Most Movement On “Standing Up For The Middle Class” & “Bringing People Together”

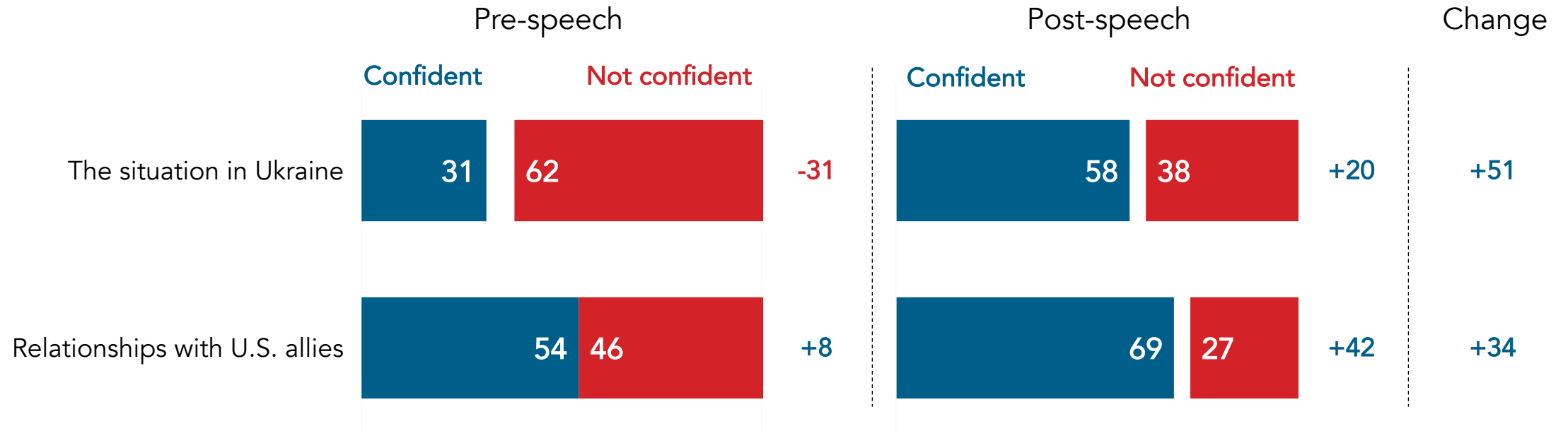
How well does each phrase describe Joe Biden?

About the Study

GBAO conducted online focus groups on February 22, 2021 with Black Americans in three markets: Atlanta, GA (more politically engaged), Philadelphia, PA (less politically engaged women), and Detroit, MI (less politically engaged men). Political engagement was defined by a combination of either educational attainment or a self-reported frequency of following news and current events. Qualitative results are not statistically projectable.
