

Support Remains High for the January 6th Investigation While January 6th Rioters Are Widely Opposed

By a 34-point margin, Americans are supportive of the House Committee's investigation into the attack on the Capitol on January 6th (63% support/29% oppose), including by a 37-point margin among independents (59% support/22% oppose).



Three in Five Report Hearing About the January 6th Hearings and a Majority Support Them

Among those who have heard "a lot" or "some" about the public hearings, 72% support the public hearings (including 57% who "strongly support" the hearings).

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
Supporters of the Republican Party Are Seen as More Inclined to Resort to Violence Than Supporters of the Democratic Party

By a 20-point margin, Americans overall are more likely to say those who support the Republican Party are inclined to resort to violence while pushing their agenda or worldview than Democrats are (net -10 agree on Democrats, net +10 agree on Republicans).

• Among independents, the margin across parties jumps to 37 points (net -16 Democrats, net +21 on Republicans).

Do you agree or disagree with the following statement?


People who support the <u>Democratic Party</u> are inclined to resort to violence when they're pushing their agenda or worldview.

People who support the <u>Republican Party</u> are inclined to resort to violence when they're pushing their agenda or worldview.




The January 6th Insurrection and Donald Trump Cited Most Among Those Who Say Republicans Are Prone to Violence

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A Variety of Recent Revelations From Recent Public Hearings Are Viewed As Concerning

Nearly four in five independents find statements about Trump knowing his supporters were armed and doing nothing (79%), ordering Secret Service to remove metal detectors (76%), and knowing the riot would become violent (79%) concerning.

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

Nearly Three in Five Support the DOJ Filing Criminal Charges Against Trump After Reading January 6th Revelations

After reading recent revelations from the January 6th hearings, Republicans shift by 13 points on net support for the Department of Justice filing criminal charges against Donald Trump (from net -53 to net -40) and independents shift by 9 (from +24 to +33).

After Messaging: One more time...do you support or oppose the Department of Justice filing criminal charges against Donald Trump for his involvement with the attack on the Capitol on January 6th?



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
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Modest Awareness of the "Proud Boys" Leads to Greater Negativity Towards the Group Once It Is Described

When described as a "militant group of white supremacists," the Proud Boys are viewed unfavorably by 65% of Americans, including majorities of Democrats (79%) and independents (62%), and half of Republicans (50%).

About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted public opinion surveys among a sample of 1,002 registered voters from July 14-July 18, 2022. 108 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 67 additional interviews were conducted among Asian American and Pacific Islander voters. 104 additional interviews were conducted among African American voters. 97 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables.
