

Ratings for President Biden have been consistent over the last month, now at net -14 overall, net -19 on handling the economy, and remaining net positive on handling the pandemic (net +4).



Majorities View a Variety of Biden's Accomplishments as Positive Outcomes for the Country

When the "Safer America Plan" is described as historic, the perception that it is a positive outcome for the country increases among Democrats, and decreases among independents (53% positive without referring to the legislation as historic, 37% positive including).




Reminding Americans of Accomplishment Increases Belief That Democrats Are Focused on Right Things

After messaging about Biden and Democrats' accomplishments, the share of independents who say the Democratic Party is focused on the right things increases by net 28 points (from +53 to +76).




About Two in Three Americans are Both Hearing About and Support the Inflation Reduction Act

The share of independents who report hearing "a lot" or "some" about the Inflation Reduction Act has increased by 10 points from mid-August (from 47% to 57%), while 67% of Americans support the plan.


Most Positive Headlines About Inflation Reduction Act Mention Medicare Negotiation and Easing Health Care Costs



Reducing Health Care Costs Seen as Both Most Believable and Having the Most Positive Impact from Inflation Reduction Act

On a list of recent headlines about the Inflation Reduction Act, headlines about reducing healthcare costs are seen as more believable and having the most positive impact on communities, while headlines about climate policies and the drug industry's rare political loss are seen as less believable and having less of a positive impact.





Biden and Democrats More Trusted on Student Loans and Health Care; Republicans Have Edge on Economy and Inflation

Biden and Democrats are more trusted on student loan debt (net +21 Democrats), lowering health care costs (+19), and holding corporations accountable (+14); Republicans are most trusted on inflation (net +9 Republicans).



Three in Five Americans Support Biden's Student Loan Forgiveness Plan

Biden's student loan announcement earns support from nearly three in five independents (57%), nearly nine in ten Black Americans (89%) and about seven in ten each of Hispanic Americans (72%) and Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders (69%)







Biden's Student Loan Plan Earns Majority Support From Those Without Debt or Who Have Already Paid their Debt Off

While support for Biden's plan is nearly universal among those currently with student loan debt (86% support/10% oppose), it also earns majority support from 56% of those who have already paid off their student loan debt and 52% who have never had student loan debt.

A Range of Arguments in Favor of Student Loan Debt Forgiveness are Convincing

Arguments focused on additional forgiveness for Pell Grant recipients (+30 net convincing) is the strongest message overall and among both Black Americans and white Americans respectively.

Below are some reasons some supporters have given for Biden to cancel student loan debt. For each, please indicate whether you find it convincing, or not.

Biden canceling student loans would allow millions to make these decisions for what makes the most sense for them now, instead of planning around years of debt The student debt burden falls most heavily on Americans who are low-income, Black, or Hispanic. By 43 +14 canceling student loan debt, Biden would help many avoid default while reducing the racial wealth gap.

About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted public opinion surveys among a sample of 1,000 registered voters from August 26-August 31, 2022. 104 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 77 additional interviews were conducted among Asian American and Pacific Islander voters. 103 additional interviews were conducted among African American voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables.
