Key Takeaways:

- Three in five Americans say abortion should be legal in all or most cases.
- Most say both Donald Trump and the Republican Party's positions are that abortion should be illegal in all or most cases, but there is less certainty around Trump's position.
- The most convincing and credible messages on abortion focus on Democrats ensuring any decision about having an abortion is made between a patient and their doctor and protecting abortion rights with some restrictions. Majorities believe it is true Republicans want to ban abortion nationwide.




The Republican Party Is Seen as More Extreme Overall Than the Democratic Party, Including By Independents

A higher share of independents describe the Republican Party as "extreme" (62% very or somewhat extreme) than say the same of the Democratic Party (54%).


Three in Five Say the GOP Position on Abortion Is Extreme, While Just Two in Five Say the Same of the Democratic Party

Americans are divided on whether the Democratic Party has an extreme position on abortion, while a clear majority say the Republican Party's position is extreme. Independents are more likely to say the Republicans' position is extreme (50%) than the Democrats' (38%).

Even one in three (35%) who think abortion should be illegal in all or most cases** say the GOP's position is extreme.



Three in Five Americans Personally Believe Abortion Should Be Legal in All or Most Cases

A clear majority of independents (57%) say abortion should be legal in all or most cases.

• The share who say they "don't know" where the Democratic Party stands on abortion has increased from 12% in April to 17% today, as the share who say Democrats think abortion should be legal in all or most cases has declined from net +67 legal to net +59.

Most Say the GOP Stands for Making Abortion Illegal in All/ Most Cases, Smaller Majority Believe the Same About Trump

While majorities say both the Republican Party and Donald Trump think abortion should be illegal in all or most cases, significantly more say that is the party's position (73%) than say the same of Trump (56%), with nearly three in ten (29%) unsure of what Trump's position is.

• The Republican Party (net -63 legal) and Trump (net -41) are deeply out of step with Americans' views on abortion (net +21 legal).



The Most Effective Messages Focus on Protecting Abortion Rights and Keeping Decisions Between Patients and Doctors

While they find it slightly less convincing, Americans are most likely to believe the message that "Republicans have always opposed Roe v. Wade and abortion rights: they fought for decades to overturn it, and will continue that fight at the state level" (85% true).

Pointing Out GOP Extremism, Distortion of Democrats' Stance on Abortion Are Good Rebuttals to Republican Attacks

Both rebuttals are convincing to independents, who side with Democrats by about a two-to-one margin on each.



More Americans See GOP as Extreme on Abortion After Messaging

Independents and those who say abortion should be legal in all or most cases* shift the most toward saying the Republican Party's position is extreme after messaging (from net +30 to net +39 extreme and from net +62 to net +70 extreme, respectively).

Again... Would you describe the Republican Party's position on abortion as...



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


"Pro-Choice" Identification Grows Slightly When the Alternative Is "Anti-Abortion" Rather Than "Pro-Life"

While three in five say they are "pro-choice" (60%) when the other option is "pro-life" (33%), nearly two in three say they are "pro-choice" (65%) when the other option is "anti-abortion" (31%).

• The groups most likely to consolidate as "pro-choice" against "anti-abortion" as compared to "pro-life" are Democrats (net +67 pro-choice against "pro-life" versus net +76 pro-choice against "anti-abortion"); Hispanic Americans (net +26 versus net +47); and women (net +34 versus +43).

Over the last 4 waves of Navigator, we have fielded this split sample question asking whether respondents identify as "pro-choice" or "pro-life," while the other half of the split sample was asked whether they identify as "pro-choice" or "anti-abortion." The data on this slide comes from a combined dataset of those 4 waves. Nationwide surveys of registered voters; Each wave represents approximately 1,000 interviews taken over the prior three-five days. Latest wave conducted September 21-September 25, 2023. 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About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted public opinion surveys among a sample of 1,000 registered voters from September 21-September 25, 2023. 105 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 75 additional interviews were conducted among Asian American and Pacific Islander voters. 104 additional interviews were conducted among African American voters. 102 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables.
