



Americans Are Most Supportive of and Hearing Most About Lowering Drug Costs and Infrastructure

While Americans broadly support and are hearing about Biden's successes on lowering prescription drug costs and investing in infrastructure, Americans strongly support but are not hearing much about manufacturing job creation and Biden standing with striking workers on the picket line, investing in domestic semiconductor manufacturing, increasing workforce participation rates while lowering unemployment rates, and passing the first major gun safety bill in 30 years.






Highlighting Biden's Accomplishments Improves His Overall Net Approval Rating By Double Digits

Highlighting President Biden's achievements boosts his net approval rating overall (from net -18 approve initially to net -7 post-messaging), driven by particularly significant gains among independents (net +20), 2020 Biden voters (net +13), AAPI Americans (+18), Hispanic Americans (net +15), and Black Americans (net +14).

Do you approve or disapprove of the way Joe Biden is handling his job as president?






Those Unfavorable to Both Trump & Biden Are Most Likely to Shift to Approve of Biden After Reading His Accomplishments

6% of Americans move from initially not approving of Biden's job performance to approving of his performance after learning about some of his achievements while in office, with those unfavorable to both Biden and Trump (17% move to approve of Biden after messaging), Americans under 35 (12%), college women (12%), and AAPI Americans (11%) among the most likely to shift.

<u>Biden Approval Movers:</u> Respondents who do not initially approve of President Biden's job performance but shift to approve of his performance after messaging about his accomplishments.






Americans Recognize a Decline in Prices at the Gas Pump

The share of Americans who say they are paying more at the pump has declined since early September (61% now, down from 78%), driven largely by declines among Republicans (67% now, down from 89%) and white Americans (59% now, down from 80%).

About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted public opinion surveys among a sample of 1,000 registered voters from October 12-October 16, 2023. 99 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 74 additional interviews were conducted among Asian American and Pacific Islander voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables.
