Methodology

Impact Research conducted a survey of N=1500 likely 2024 general election voters in 61 battleground congressional districts.

100% of interviews were conducted by text-to-web.



Interviews were conducted between January 11-15, 2024. Trended results from the October, July and April surveys are from interviews conducted between October 19-25, 2023, July 6-12, 2023 and April 20-27, 2023, respectively.



The margin of error for a sample of this size is +/- 2.5 percentage points at the 95% level of confidence. The margin of error for subgroups varies and is higher.






- Most battleground constituents view the events of January 6th as a deliberate attempt to disrupt the peaceful transfer of power. This includes a majority of independents; only one in three dismiss January 6th as a one-time incident that's in the past.
- Mike Johnson is unpopular among those who know him, but many can't identify him unless he's described as the current speaker. Even with a description, most opinions are soft.
- Majorities of battleground constituents express very serious concerns about Mike Johnson and **Republican lawmakers' agenda.** The top concerns include cutting Social Security, banning abortion, and rigging the tax system in favor of the wealthy.




Which of the following do you agree with more, even if neither is exactly right?







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Exposure to House Republicans' Agenda Decreases Johnson's Popularity, Particularly Among Independents and Persuadables




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Learning Their Republican Representative Supports Mike Johnson's Agenda is Deeply Concerning to Constituents

About the Study

Impact Research conducted public opinion surveys among a sample of 1,500 likely 2024 general election voters from January 11-15, 2024. The survey was conducted by text-to-web (100 percent). Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the 61 congressional districts included in the sample across a variety of demographic variables. The margin of error for the full sample at the 95 percent level of confidence is +/- 2.5 percentage points. The margin for error for subgroups varies and is higher.
