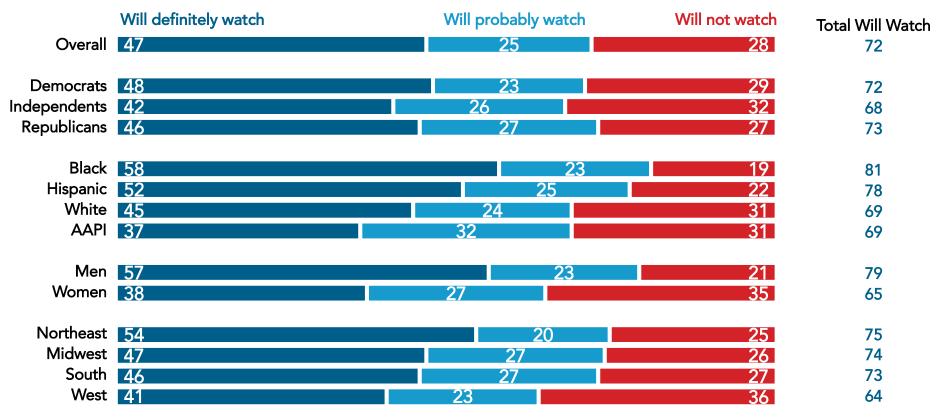
- Majorities of Americans report planning to watch at least part of the Super Bowl across partisanship, race, and region of the country.

Three in Four Say They Will Watch at Least Part of the Super Bowl

Black Americans (58%), men (57%), and Americans in the Northeast (54%) are most likely to say they will definitely watch at least part of it.

Americans in the Northeast primarily name pizza and wings; Americans in the Midwest and West are particularly likely to say nachos, while Americans in the South and Midwest also add hot dogs to their list.

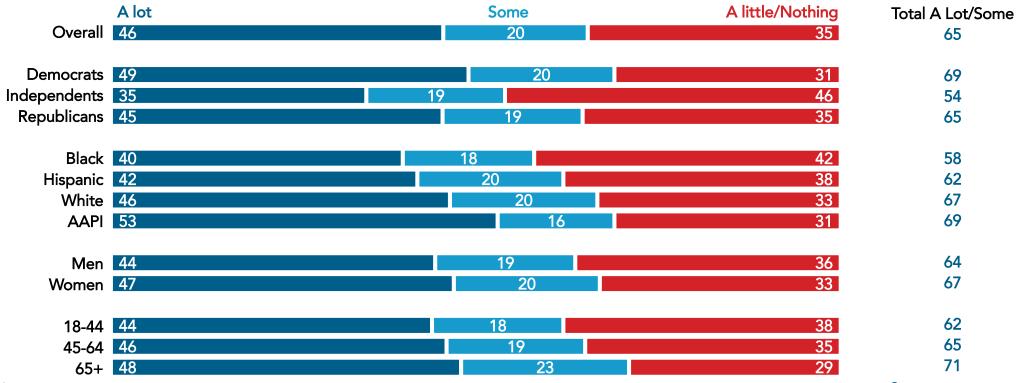

Americans Are Deeply Aware of Taylor Swift and Travis Kelce Dating

When asked in November, 56% of Americans rated Taylor Swift positively, and just 29% negatively; on Travis Kelce, 31% rated him positively, 12% negatively.

Please indicate how much you have seen, read, or heard about: Taylor Swift and Travis Kelce are dating.

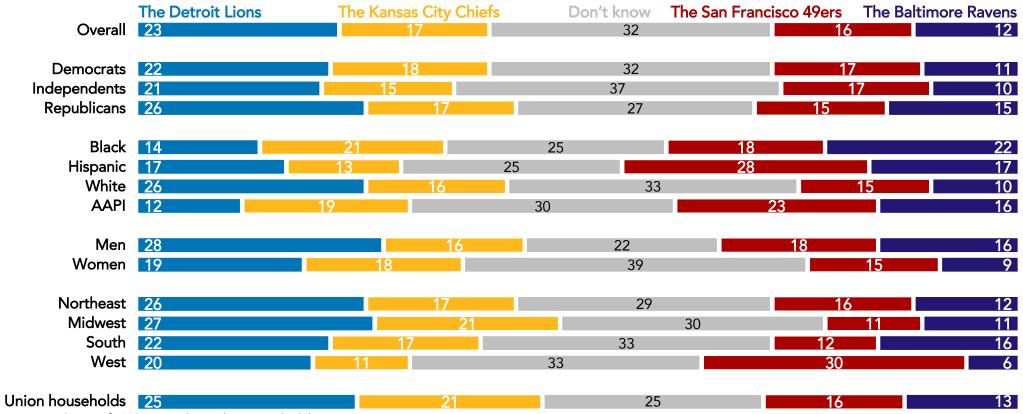




Before the AFC and NFC Championships, the Lions Were America's Favorite

About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted public opinion surveys among a sample of 1,000 registered voters from January 25-January 29, 2024. 100 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 75 additional interviews were conducted among Asian American and Pacific Islander voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables.
