



Views of TikTok Are Mixed

Independents (net +11 favorable) and Democrats (net +7) view TikTok favorably, while a majority of Republicans view it unfavorably (net -22).

• Baby Boomers hold deeply negative views (net -42 favorable), while Millennials (net +21) and Gen Z (net +37) view it much more favorably.

Please indicate how favorable or unfavorable you are to: TikTok.








A Plurality Oppose a TikTok Ban, Though Nearly Half Support When It Is Explained

While a plurality of Democrats oppose a ban on the initial ask (net -7 support), half support the ban once it is explained (net +13).




Majorities Support Reclassifying or Legalizing Marijuana

Democrats and independents are more likely to support reclassifying marijuana (net +75 and net +70, respectively) than legalizing marijuana for recreational use (net +62 and net +33), though large majorities support both.

(Split sample) As you may or may not know, the Biden administration recently announced its intention to reclassify marijuana as a less dangerous drug, enabling further research into its potential medical uses and benefits.

About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted a public opinion survey among a sample of 1,000 registered voters from May 9-May 12, 2024. 100 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 72 additional interviews were conducted among Asian American and Pacific Islander voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables.
