JD Vance: A Guide for Advocates

Key Takeaways:

- Nearly half of Americans view JD Vance unfavorably, with three in five hearing negative information about him recently (compared to just a third who are hearing positive information).
- The negative information Americans report hearing is about his comments about women and families without children; almost three in five say that Vance supports abortion being illegal in all or most cases.
- Of Vance's comments, the most concerning are him saying that Americans with no children deserve fewer rights (including voting rights), saying people should stay in marriages that were "maybe even violent," attacking the Affordable Care Act, being endorsed by neo-Nazis, and supporting abortion bans.




Nearly Half of Americans View JD Vance Unfavorably

Almost three in four Democrats (72%) and more than two in five independents (43%) view JD Vance unfavorably. Non-MAGA Republicans* are split on Vance: 37% view him favorably and 26% view him unfavorably.

• Among childless cat ladies**, JD Vance is underwater by 40 points (15% favorable/55% unfavorable).

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
Half of Americans Report Hearing About Vance Recently; What They Are Hearing Is Broadly Negative

A majority of Americans report hearing "a lot" or "some" about JD Vance recently (52%). When asked the nature of what they have heard, nearly three in five (57%) report hearing a mix of positive and negative content or fully negative content.

• Both independents (54% negative, 32% positive) and non-MAGA Republicans* (49%, 44%) report hearing more negative than positive.

Over the past few days, has what you have seen, read, or heard recently about JD Vance been mostly:



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


Vance's Comments About Women, Abortion, Families Without Children Arise in What Americans Are Hearing










A Majority of Americans Say Vance Believes Abortion Should Be Illegal in All or Most Cases

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


Learning More Pushes Nearly Three in Five to Disapprove of Vance as Trump's VP Choice

Approval of Trump choosing Vance to be his running mate declines by a net 23 points after messaging (from net -5 to net -28), including significant swings among independents (a net 25-point decline) and non-MAGA Republicans* (a net 45-point decline).

[Post-messaging] One more time...Do you approve or disapprove of Donald Trump selecting JD Vance to be his running mate for president?




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Those Who Move to Disapprove of Trump Choosing Vance: Non-MAGA GOP, Moms and GOP Women, Childless Cat Ladies

Roughly one in five Americans move to disapprove of Trump selecting Vance to run as his Vice President (19%), including 27% of non-MAGA Republicans, 27% of moms, 26% of Republican women, and 26% of childless cat ladies**.

Vance Movers (19% of the electorate): those who initially approve or are not sure whether they approve of Donald Trump selecting JD Vance to be his running mate, and then disapprove of the choice after learning more.

About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted a public opinion survey among a sample of 1,000 registered voters from August 1-August 4, 2024. 100 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 75 additional interviews were conducted among African American voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. 200 additional interviews were conducted among voters ages 18-34. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables. The margin of error for the full sample at the 95 percent level of confidence is +/- 3.1 percentage points. The margin for error for subgroups varies and is higher.

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
