Young Americans: Ideological and Policy Assessment

This poll was in the field during the first presidential debate, but fielded entirely before the attempted assassination of Donald Trump, the announcement of Joe Biden's departure from the 2024 presidential race, and his endorsement of Kamala Harris for president.

Methodology

Global Strategy Group conducted a public opinion survey among 4,000 nationwide registered voters between the ages of 18 and 34, between June 18th through July 11th, 2024. 800 interviews were conducted per mode, using each of the following five methodologies:

- Live phone interviews (verified against a voter file)
- Text-to-web interviews (verified against a voter file)
- Online panel interviews (verified against a voter file)
- Online panel interviews (NOT verified against a voter file)
- Online interviews where participants were recruited via social media platforms (NOT verified against a voter file)

Each set of 800 interviews was individually weighted and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our samples in each mode matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables. The same process was then done to the combined dataset. Some questions were asked of all respondents except live phone interviews for time's sake. In those cases, the other four modes were weighted using the same process.

Unless otherwise indicated, data throughout refers to the total of all five modes wherever possible, and on questions asked on all but phone interviews, the total of those four modes.



Key Takeaways:

- Younger Americans side with the more progressive viewpoint on a number of major topical issues, by margins that are often larger than the Democratic advantage on party identification or the liberal advantage on self-described ideology.
- Younger Americans are most likely to agree with the progressive position in debates related to the economy and democracy, with narrower margins when it comes to culture issues like immigration and policing.
- Among younger men and white Americans, their issue positions tend to be more progressive than their political identity. For younger Black Americans and those describing themselves as liberal, the reverse is true: they identify more with the Democratic Party more than they agree with some progressive issue positions.



Issue Landscape:


- On the economy, younger Americans widely favor higher taxes for the wealthy and big corporations and government to be more involved in the health care system.
- Two in three young Americans think our country is better off if elected leaders always respect democracy rather than break rules to get things done.
- Nearly three in five Americans in this age group take the more progressive position on policing and immigration.
- Economic frustration can play a role in the way younger Americans feel about a range of issues, including climate change, foreign policy, and retirement policies. Placing a progressive position in tension with the younger generation's financial well-being erodes support.
- A third of younger Americans have "very strong" feelings about the war in Israel and Gaza, and they are more likely to show sympathy for the Palestinians over the Israelis.

Progressive Statements of the Ideological Scale

Our country is better off if elected leaders always respect the rules of our democracy and can be held accountable when they break the law.

Abortion should generally be legal - it is a decision that should be between a woman, her family, and her doctor, not the government and politicians.

To lower health care costs, the government should be more involved in providing health care and do more to take on drug and insurance companies that raise prices to pad their profits.

The wealthiest Americans and big corporations should pay more in taxes so we can invest more in the middle class and working people.

Our leaders need to stop demonizing immigrants and instead put forth solutions to fix our broken immigration system by increasing border security and offering a path to citizenship.

We need to pass common sense gun laws like background checks and banning assault weapons to reduce mass shootings in our schools and communities.

The bigger danger for our country is people who spread lies and encourage political violence when they disagree with election results, like the attack at the U.S. Capitol on January 6th, 2021.

We need to reform our system to make the criminal justice system fairer and avoid over-policing.

We need to stand up to politicians trying to block transgender people from receiving basic health care, education, and legal recognition.



On the Whole, Young Americans' Policy Preferences Lean Further to the Left Than Their Partisan or Ideological Self-Identification

While young Americans lean towards the Democratic party on self-identification by 11 points and towards identifying as liberal by 15 points, their total ideology score*, or net lean towards progressive viewpoints on a range of issues, is +28 progressive.

Young Americans Across the Political Spectrum Lean Progressive on Issues, Especially Around the Economy and Democracy

Weak and strong Democrats alike overwhelmingly fall on the progressive end of the ideological scale, while independents also lean towards progressive positioning across issues and even weak Republicans do on the economy and on democracy issues.








Young Americans Lean More Progressive Than Their Party ID Suggests, Outside of Black Americans

Difference: Prog. - Cons.






Which statement do you agree with more?








Young Americans Stand Against Political Violence and Believe in Democracy Over Autocracy



Young Americans across the board are more conservative on transgender issues than abortion or guns.






At Least Half of Voters Take the More Progressive View on Both Immigration and Policing









Two in Three Young Americans Have Strong Feelings About Israel-Gaza, But Only a Third Have "Very Strong" Feelings

When it comes to the war in Israel and Gaza, is this an issue about which you have strong feelings?









A Third of Young Americans Sympathize More With Palestinians in the Israel-Gaza Conflict, One in Five More With the Israelis

In the Israeli-Palestinian conflict are your sympathies more with the Israelis or the Palestinians?








A Slim Majority Across Age Groups Believes School Closures in the Pandemic Were Necessary
