




Americans Across Party Lines Have Grown Less Favorable To Elon Musk Since Early January

Elon Musk's popularity rating has declined from net -6 favorable in mid-January to net -14 in this latest poll, driven by declines across party lines: from net -62 to net -70 among Democrats, net -14 to net -20 among independents, and net +54 to net +47 among Republicans.

Please indicate how favorable or unfavorable you are to: Elon Musk.








Americans See the Influence of Tech CEOs, Like Musk, in Trump's Administration as a Bad Thing for the Country

Nearly 70% believe tech CEOs will have "a lot" or "some" influence in the Trump administration, and Democrats (80%) and independents (47%) see this as more of a bad thing, as do a third of 2024 Trump voters who do not strongly approve of the job he is doing (32%).



Americans Are More Concerned Trump Will Go Too Far With Spending Cuts Than Not Far Enough by a 2:1 Margin

A majority of Democrats (87%), independents (52%), and 40% of 2024 Trump voters who do not strongly approve of the job he's doing are worried he will go too far with cuts, while three in five Trump voters who strongly approve are more concerned Congress will stop him (61%).



Nearly Half Say Trump Is Focused on the Wrong Things; More Feel This Way After Learning About His First Actions

Almost half of independents think Trump is focused on the wrong things (49%), and a majority say so after learning more (52%).

• After learning more, white Americans shift the most toward believing Trump is focused on the wrong things (from net +9 right things to net +3, a net shift of -6 points).

Majorities View the CDC, FEMA Favorably; Pluralities Say the Same of NIH, Though More Are Unfamiliar

Nearly two in three are favorable to the CDC, and pluralities across party lines view the NIH more favorably than unfavorably.

• While FEMA's ratings since 2022 remain steadily positive among Democrats and independents, Republicans have grown far more unfavorable to the agency (from net +33 favorable in October 2022 to net -13 favorable now).

Mark Zuckerberg and Jeff Bezos Are Broadly Unpopular

Both Mark Zuckerberg and Jeff Bezos are viewed unfavorably across party lines, especially among independents (net -44 favorable on Zuckerberg, net -13 favorable on Bezos). Both are underwater with Trump 2024 voters who strongly approve of the job Trump is doing (net -4 Zuckerberg, net -3 Bezos) and those who do not strongly approve (net -18 Zuckerberg, net -2 Bezos).

About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted a public opinion survey among a sample of 1,000 registered voters from January 30-February 3, 2025. 100 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 73 additional interviews were conducted among Asian American and Pacific Islander voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables. The margin of error for the full sample at the 95 percent level of confidence is +/- 3.1 percentage points. The margin of error for subgroups varies and is higher.
