The Political Landscape in the Battleground and How Policies of Democrats in Congress Are Viewed





Methodology



Impact Research conducted a survey of N=1,500 likely 2026 general election voters in 62 battleground congressional districts.



100% of interviews were conducted by text-to-web.



Interviews were conducted between February 21 – February 25, 2025.



The margin of error for a sample of this size is +/- 2.5 percentage points at the 95% level of confidence. The margin of error for subgroups varies and is higher.



Key Takeaways

- Half of battleground constituents and two in three persuadables rate economic issues as one of
 the top issues they want Congress to prioritize. More than one in three constituents say they want
 Congress to prioritize threats to democracy, while another quarter of constituents want government
 spending and debt to be prioritized.
- Battleground constituents have net negative opinions about prominent Republicans in Washington. President Donald Trump, Vice President JD Vance, Speaker Mike Johnson, and Elon Musk all have net negative favorability ratings. Moreover, Trump's overall job rating and rating on handling the economy are both underwater.
- Constituents in the battleground strongly support many policies supported by Democrats in Congress, and proactive support outpaces opposing policies supported by Republicans in Congress. Some of the most supported policies include bringing back manufacturing jobs, protecting Medicare's ability to negotiate, passing a middle-class tax cut, and banning members of Congress from trading stocks.



Vance, Johnson, and Musk All Have Net Negative Favorability Ratings in Battleground Districts








Trump's Favorability is Underwater in Battleground Districts; Independents Split Roughly Evenly






Trump's Overall Job Rating and Economic Handling Are Both Underwater

Do you approve or disapprove of the way Donald Trump is handling the economy?




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Battleground Constituents are Most Concerned About Musk and Other Billionaires Consolidating Power in Government

Which of the following is the biggest concern for you personally, even if none are exactly right?






Bringing Back Manufacturing, Preserving Medicare Negotiation Among the Most Impactful Policies of Democrats in Congress

Bringing Back Manufacturing and Banning Members of Congress From Trading Stocks Have Significant Bipartisan Appeal




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Standing Up to the Trump Administration's Mass Deportation Efforts Has Little Support Outside of Democrats




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Policies from Democrats in Congress Are More Popular When Framed Proactively Rather Than Framed as Stopping Republicans




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Battleground Constituents Narrowly Prefer Democrats in Congress Stand Up to the Trump Administration

About the Study

Impact Research conducted public opinion surveys among a sample of 1,500 likely 2026 general election voters from February 21 - 25, 2025. The survey was conducted by text-to-web (100 percent). Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the 62 congressional districts included in the sample across a variety of demographic variables. The margin of error for the full sample at the 95 percent level of confidence is +/- 2.5 percentage points. The margin for error for subgroups varies and is higher.
