The last time Trump and Republicans passed a tax law it benefited the wealthy and corporations by handing them significant tax breaks while it did next to nothing for middle class and working people. Giving them another tax cut would give wealthy foreign investors a tax break of roughly \$24 billion in just one year and could allow large corporations to pay next to nothing in federal income taxes. They already gave massive tax breaks to these groups back in 2017 and are trying to do it again.
