Key Takeaways:

- Roughly two in three Americans say that Trump thinks he's above the law, on par with the share who said the same following the first impeachment inquiry into his actions in 2019.
- A range of actions Trump has taken in his second term are both deeply concerning and seen as a threat to democracy, including Musk accessing Americans' personal data, Trump violating multiple court rulings, and Trump going after federal agencies and employees.
- Americans are most concerned that Trump is abusing his power, violating the Constitution, and acting like he is above the law.



Nearly Two in Three Say Trump Thinks He's Above the Law

Almost two in three Americans say Trump thinks he's above the law (63%), in line with the share who said the same after the first impeachment inquiry into Trump in 2019.

• Roughly two in three independents (65%) and a majority of non-MAGA Republicans (51%) say Trump thinks he's above the law.

About Navigator

In a world where the news cycle is the length of a tweet, our leaders often lack the real-time public-sentiment analysis to shape the best approaches to talking about the issues that matter the most. Navigator is designed to act as a consistent, flexible, responsive tool to inform policy debates by conducting research and reliable guidance to inform allies, elected leaders, and the press. Navigator is a project led by pollsters from Global Strategy Group and GBAO along with an advisory committee, including: Jessica Floyd, The Hub Project; Christina Reynolds; Mike Podhorzer; Jesse Ferguson, progressive strategist; Navin Nayak, Center for American Progress Action Fund; Stephanie Valencia, EquisLabs; and Melanie Newman, Planned Parenthood Action Fund.

About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted a public opinion survey among a sample of 1,000 registered voters from April 3-April 7, 2025. 100 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 75 additional interviews were conducted among Asian American and Pacific Islander voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables. The margin of error for the full sample at the 95 percent level of confidence is +/- 3.1 percentage points. The margin of error for subgroups varies and is higher.
