
- Trump has a corruption problem. Americans think Republicans are more corrupt than Democrats, a sentiment that grows when Trump is added to the mix. And, a growing number thinks Trump is bringing more corruption to Washington rather than fixing it.
- But, that does *not* mean Americans absolve Democrats on corruption. Rather, it is far more effective to talk about corruption as a problem across both parties that needs to be addressed, than a problem that is unique to President Trump.
- The most bothersome government corruption generally to Americans centers around personal profiteering and abusing power to punish critics or reward allies.
- To that end, Trump's biggest corruption problems right now are Musk benefiting from government contracts (abusing power to reward allies), firing independent watchdogs (abusing power to silence critics), and accepting the luxury jet from Qatar (personal profiteering).

Republicans Are Seen As More Corrupt Than Democrats, Especially With Trump in the Mix

Nearly half say "Trump and the Republican Party" are more corrupt than Democrats (49%), while 44% say the same of just Republicans.

• However, a plurality of independents say both parties are equally corrupt.

Which do you think is more corrupt?








Americans Are Divided on Who They Trust More to Handle Corruption in Government

More than two in five independents are not sure who to trust more when it comes to handling corruption in government (41%).


Please indicate who you personally trust more to handle: Corruption in government.





A Slim But Growing Majority Say Trump Is Bringing More Corruption to Washington, Driven By Shifts With Independents

Since February, independents have moved a net 14 points toward saying Trump is bringing more corruption to Washington rather than fixing it (from net +8 bringing corruption to net +22).



The Best Way to Talk About Trump's Corruption Acknowledges It As a Problem Across Washington, As Opposed to Just Trump

Both independents (net +49 agree with progressive view versus net +12) and non-MAGA Republicans* (net +16 versus net -32) agree more with an argument that acknowledges "Washington has a major corruption problem in both parties" than one that doesn't.

About Navigator

In a world where the news cycle is the length of a tweet, our leaders often lack the real-time public-sentiment analysis to shape the best approaches to talking about the issues that matter the most. Navigator is designed to act as a consistent, flexible, responsive tool to inform policy debates by conducting research and reliable guidance to inform allies, elected leaders, and the press. Navigator is a project led by pollsters from Global Strategy Group and GBAO along with an advisory committee, including: Jessica Floyd, The Hub Project; Christina Reynolds; Mike Podhorzer; Jesse Ferguson, progressive strategist; Navin Nayak, Center for American Progress Action Fund; Stephanie Valencia, EquisLabs; and Melanie Newman, Planned Parenthood Action Fund.

About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted a public opinion survey among a sample of 1,000 registered voters from May 15-May 18, 2025. 100 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 76 additional interviews were conducted among Asian American and Pacific Islander voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables. The margin of error for the full sample at the 95 percent level of confidence is +/- 3.1 percentage points. The margin of error for subgroups varies and is higher.
