Trump's Immigration Agenda: A Guide for Advocates







Key Takeaways:

- Trump is underwater on his immigration approval rating. But, he and Republicans are still more trusted than Democrats on the issue.
- Few Americans are surprised by the actions Trump has taken on immigration.
- Two in five Americans have seen images of arrests or mistreatment of immigrants they have found concerning, and nearly half are worried about people in their community being targeted for deportation.
- Americans feel Trump has been targeting all undocumented immigrants for deportation, not just violent criminals, and a majority feel he has been too aggressive in his approach.

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Lay of the Immigration Landscape






While Trump Is in the Red on Immigration, Democrats Do Not Have the Advantage Either


Though Trump is underwater by 3 points on his approval rating on immigration, he and Republicans are more trusted than Democrats by 8 points on the issue. A large share of independents say they "don't know" who to trust more on immigration (36% don't know).



Few Americans Have Been Surprised By Trump's Immigration Actions

Seven in ten Americans say they expected Trump's actions on immigration (70%), including 60% of independents, though roughly two in five immigration cross-pressured Americans* (39%) and disappointed/regretful Trump voters** (41%) say they have been surprised.


One in Ten Know Someone Who Has Been Deported/Detained By ICE, Two in Five Have Seen Concerning Images

At least half of Black (50%), Hispanic (56%), and AAPI (58%) Americans have seen images of an arrest, deportation, or mistreatment of an immigrant that they found concerning. One in five Hispanic Americans know someone who has been detained or deported by ICE (19%).

[Split Sample] In the last few months, have you seen a picture or video of an arrest, deportation, or mistreatment of an immigrant you found concerning?




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
One in Five Are Worried About Friends/Family Being Deported; Nearly Half Worry About People in Their Community

Democrats (74%) and Hispanic Americans (59%) are the most worried about people in their community being targeted for deportation by ICE, as well as family members or friends (31% and 39%, respectively).

[Split Sample] How worried are you that <u>people in your community</u> may be targeted for deportation by ICE?




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Americans Feel Trump Has Been Targeting Immigrants Indiscriminately and Has Been Too Aggressive in His Approach

A majority say Trump has been too aggressive in his deportation approach (52%), including 37% of non-MAGA Republicans*. Two in three also say he has been targeting all undocumented immigrants, not just criminals (65%), including 54% of non-MAGA Republicans*.

Roughly One in Six Americans Don't Trust Democrats to Handle Immigration, But Say Trump Is Being Too Aggressive


Americans unfavorable to both parties (34% are immigration cross-pressured), non-conservative independents and Republicans (26%), and non-MAGA Republicans* (24%) are disproportionately likely to fall into this category.



In thinking about how Trump has handled the issue of deportations, which do you agree with more? He has been too aggressive





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






Trump's Mass Deportation Plan Has Grown Increasingly Unpopular Since Pre-Inauguration

Since January, support for Trump's deportation plan has declined by a net 14 points (from net +10 support to net -4). Some of the sharpest declines in support are among non-MAGA Republicans* (from net +50 to net +27) and Black Americans (from net -4 to net -41).








Framing Remains Crucial on Mass Deportation; Explaining Who Is Being Targeted Increases Opposition

Support for Trump's framing has declined by a net 21 points since January (from net +41 support to net +20), driven by Democrats (from net -1 support to net -42) – though a majority of Americans continue to support a conservative framing of Trump's deportation plan (57%).


A Balanced Approach Beats an Enforcement/Deportation Focus: Pivoting From a Broken System Strengthens It Further

Which of these two approaches to immigration do you prefer the federal government pursue?

<u>Focusing on strict enforcement and mass deportation</u> by having ICE target all immigrants who are here illegally for deportation, with the goal of deporting millions of people each year, while investing in border security, detention centers, and increased enforcement to deter future illegal immigration.




Presenting the Alternative to Mass Deportation Is Crucial to Shifting and Winning the Debate Against It

While Americans oppose Trump's mass deportation plan by 4 points, they prefer paths to legal status over mass deportation by 36 points.






Half of Americans Rate ICE Negatively

Please indicate how favorable or unfavorable you are to: ICE, also known as Immigration and Customs Enforcement.




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Nearly Half Oppose Trump's Increased Use of ICE Raids

Do you support or oppose Trump's increased use of ICE (Immigration and Customs Enforcement) raids in recent weeks in Los Angeles and other cities?




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Americans See ICE Raids As Causing Chaos, Spreading Fear, and Disrupting the Economy




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Trump's Approach to Mass Deportations Is Unpopular, Including Targeting All Immigrants and Using Military Force

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Best Descriptors of Concerns About Trump on Immigration: Cruel and Inhumane, Violating the Constitution, Separating Families

Independents (32%) and non-MAGA Republicans* (30%) say that "separating families" best describes their concerns about Trump's approach to immigration. Democrats drive the share concerned about cruel and inhumane treatment of immigrants (48%).

About Navigator

In a world where the news cycle is the length of a tweet, our leaders often lack the real-time public-sentiment analysis to shape the best approaches to talking about the issues that matter the most. Navigator is designed to act as a consistent, flexible, responsive tool to inform policy debates by conducting research and reliable guidance to inform allies, elected leaders, and the press. Navigator is a project led by pollsters from Global Strategy Group and GBAO along with an advisory committee, including: Jessica Floyd, The Hub Project; Christina Reynolds; Mike Podhorzer; Jesse Ferguson, progressive strategist; Navin Nayak; Stephanie Valencia, EquisLabs; and Melanie Newman, Planned Parenthood Action Fund.

About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted a public opinion survey among a sample of 1,000 registered voters from June 26-June 30, 2025. 100 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 75 additional interviews were conducted among Asian American and Pacific Islander voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables. The margin of error for the full sample at the 95 percent level of confidence is +/- 3.1 percentage points. The margin of error for subgroups varies and is higher.
