Trump's National Guard Deployment: A Guide for Advocates

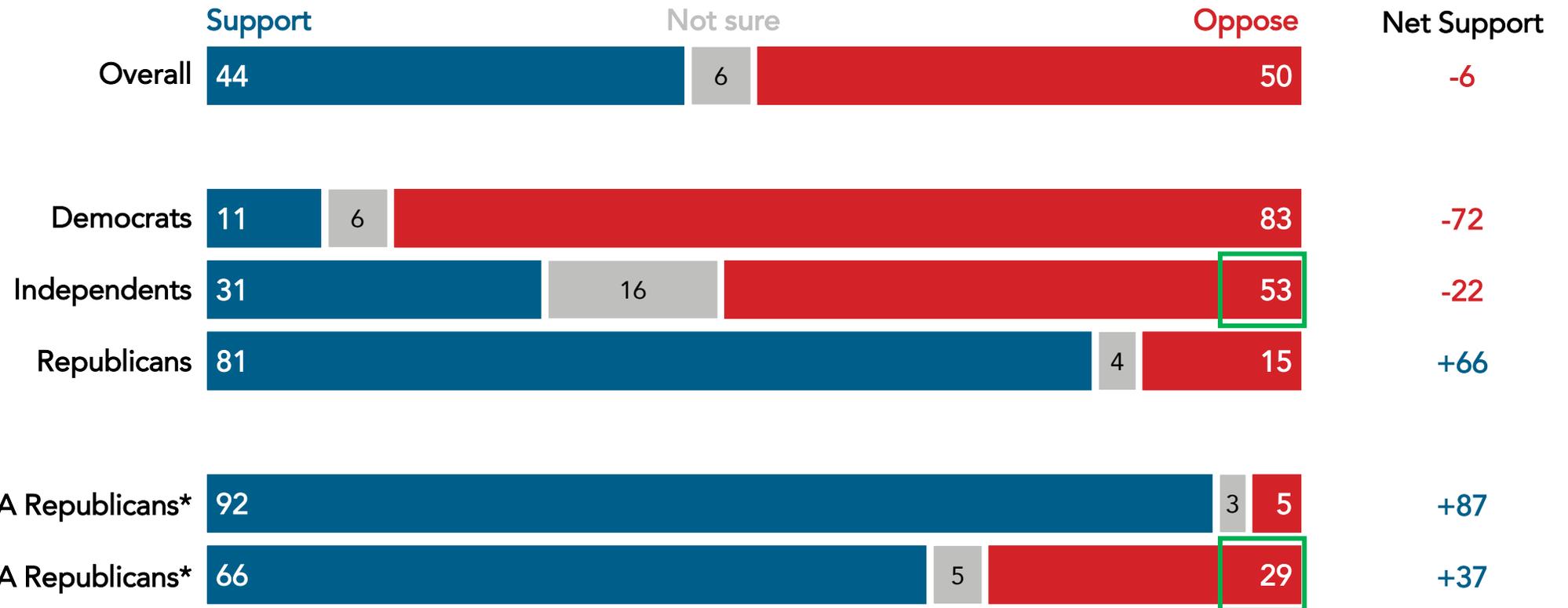
Key Takeaways:

- Americans are divided on Trump deploying the National Guard to D.C., with half opposing the move.
- Crime remains an important issue and debate. But, despite divided opinions on Trump's deployment of the National Guard, Americans trust Trump and Republicans more than Democrats to protect law and order, keep Americans safe, and handle crime.
- To win this debate, Democrats need to acknowledge the problem and demonstrate both why deploying the National Guard is not the solution and provide an alternative vision to solve the problem.

Half of Americans Oppose Trump Deploying National Guard Troops to D.C.

A majority of independents (53%) and 29% of non-MAGA Republicans* oppose the move.

Regardless of how closely you've been following the situation, do you support or oppose Trump deploying National Guard troops and federal agents to patrol Washington, D.C.?



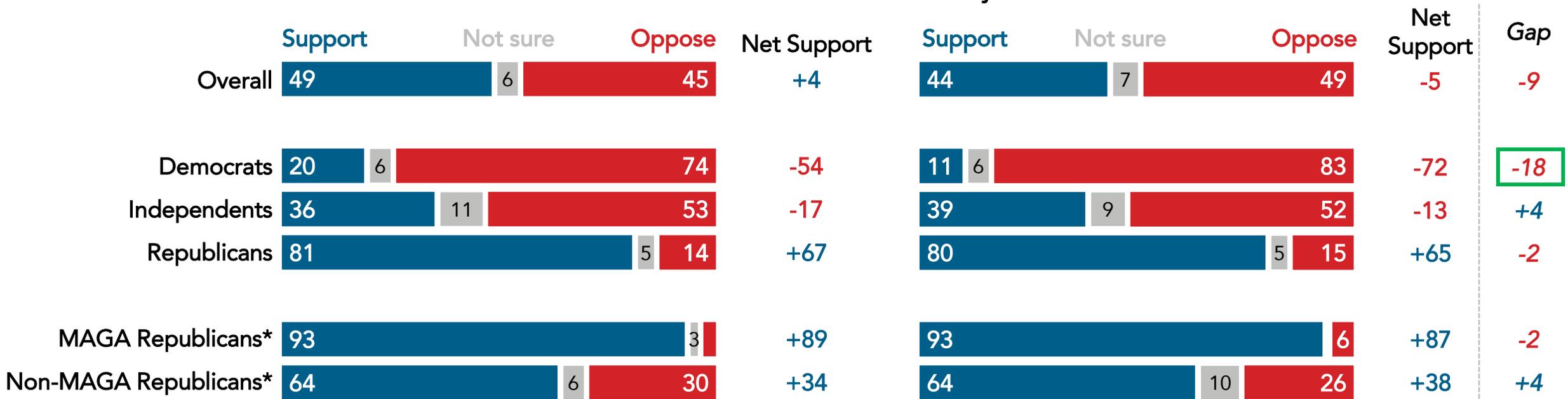

Mention of Trump in the National Guard Deployment Helps to Drive Up Opposition Among Democrats

Mentioning Trump when discussing the deployment of National Guard troops to big cities drives up opposition among Democrats (18-point net gap), though it does little to change views among independents (4-point net gap) or Republicans (2-point net gap).

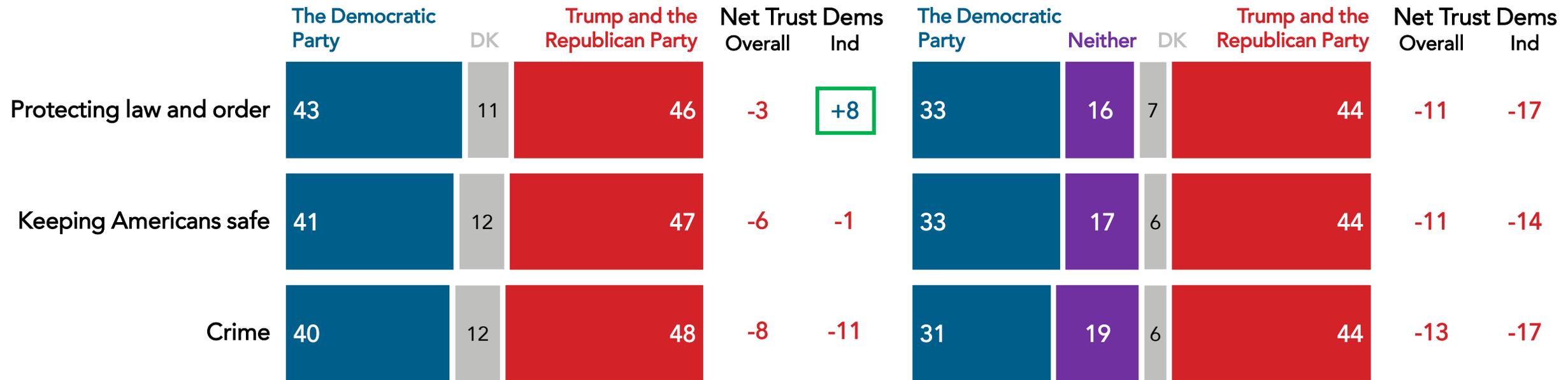


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Trump and Republicans Are More Trusted Than Democrats on Law and Order, Safety, and Crime Overall

Independents trust the Democratic Party more to protect law and order (net +8 trust Democrats), though a plurality of independents say they “don’t trust either party” when given the option (43% neither).

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Instead of Solely Hitting Trump for the D.C. Deployment, It Helps to Acknowledge the Crime Problem and Provide an Alternative

Nearly two in three Americans agree more with a statement acknowledging crime is a problem before pivoting to alternative policy solutions, rather than deploying armed troops (net +28 agree with anti-Trump statement), including majorities of independents (net +36). Fewer side against Trump's deployment of troops when the rebuttal is singularly a hit on Trump for the decision (net +2 overall).

[TRUMP HIT] Those who say Trump is breaking the law by deploying the National Guard, manufacturing fear and social media moments, hurting small businesses, and not making cities any safer

Trump and Republicans who say that people don't feel safe, and it's time we took action to change that. The National Guard is helping to restore safety and security to our nation's cities



[CRIME CONCESSION/ALTERNATIVE] Those who say our country has a serious problem with crime and safety, but deploying armed troops in our streets isn't the answer. We need to support local law enforcement, keep guns out of criminals' hands, and do more to address the root causes of crime like poverty, drug addiction, and mental illness

Navigator is designed to act as a consistent, flexible, responsive tool to inform policy debates by conducting research and reliable guidance to inform allies, elected leaders, and the press. About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted a public opinion survey among a sample of 1,000 registered voters from September 4-September 8, 2025. 100 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among African American voters. 75 additional interviews were conducted among Asian American and Pacific Islander voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables. The margin of error for the full sample at the 95 percent level of confidence is +/- 3.1 percentage points. The margin of error for subgroups varies and is higher.
