Key Takeaways:

- Americans have mixed views on the quality of their health care, while they rate the availability and affordability of their health care negatively.
- Americans across party think it should be easier to be healthy in the U.S. (including accessing healthy foods), that there are major issues with our health care system, and that corporations should be held accountable for pollution and rigging the health care system to pad their profits.
- MAGA Republicans stand apart from other groups on health and wellness, with stronger preferences
 for doing their own research over trusting doctors and health professionals, feeling like Americans
 have become overly reliant on vaccines and prescription drugs and that we should return to more
 alternative medical treatments, and that the government should provide less access to medicine and
 vaccines rather than more. Non-MAGA Republicans, independents, and Democrats are aligned against
 these views.
- Health care professionals are the most trusted resources on health and wellness, though Americans who hold less traditional views of health and wellness gravitate just as much if not more toward online resources and social media.



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


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A Broad Bipartisan Consensus Exists Around Trusting Doctors, Health Professionals on Medicine and Health

Majorities of Democrats (88%) and independents (68%) trust doctors and health professionals on medicine and health, as do majorities of both non-MAGA Republicans* (80%) and MAGA Republicans* (59%).

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
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Two in Three Agree Medicine and Vaccines Have Saved Lives and Have Done a Lot of Good for Society

A majority of independents (59%) and non-MAGA Republicans* (70%) agree that medicine like vaccines is positive, but majorities of MAGA Republicans* (60%) agree more that we have become overly reliant on things like vaccines and prescription drugs.

Which of the following statements do you agree with more, even if neither is exactly right?



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
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Americans Prefer Government Provide More Access to Medicine and Vaccines Rather Than Less, Even if Less Tested


RFK Is Viewed Increasingly Negatively, While Americans Are More Positive on "Make America Healthy Again" (MAHA)

About Navigator

In a world where the news cycle is the length of a tweet, our leaders often lack the real-time public-sentiment analysis to shape the best approaches to talking about the issues that matter the most. Navigator is designed to act as a consistent, flexible, responsive tool to inform policy debates by conducting research and reliable guidance to inform allies, elected leaders, and the press. Navigator is a project led by pollsters from Global Strategy Group and GBAO along with an advisory committee, including: Jessica Floyd, The Hub Project; Christina Reynolds; Mike Podhorzer; Jesse Ferguson, progressive strategist; Navin Nayak; Stephanie Valencia, EquisLabs; and Melanie Newman, Planned Parenthood Action Fund.

About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted a public opinion survey among a sample of 1,000 registered voters from September 4-September 8, 2025. 100 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among African American voters. 75 additional interviews were conducted among Asian American and Pacific Islander voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables. The margin of error for the full sample at the 95 percent level of confidence is +/- 3.1 percentage points. The margin of error for subgroups varies and is higher.

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
