
REPSCONGRESSPOS. [IF POSITIVE/MIXED] In a few words, what positive things have you seen, read, or heard recently about Republicans in Congress?





Q4. [IF A NEGATIVE IMPRESSION] And what, specifically, do you think Democrats in Congress are fighting for in this government shutdown?




