Views of Tariffs in the Congressional Battleground





#### Methodology



Impact Research conducted a survey of N=1,500 likely 2026 general election constituents in 61 battleground congressional districts.



100% of interviews were conducted by text-to-web.



Interviews were conducted between September 18 – 21, 2025.



The margin of error for a sample of this size is +/- 2.5 percentage points at the 95% level of confidence. The margin of error for subgroups varies and is higher.



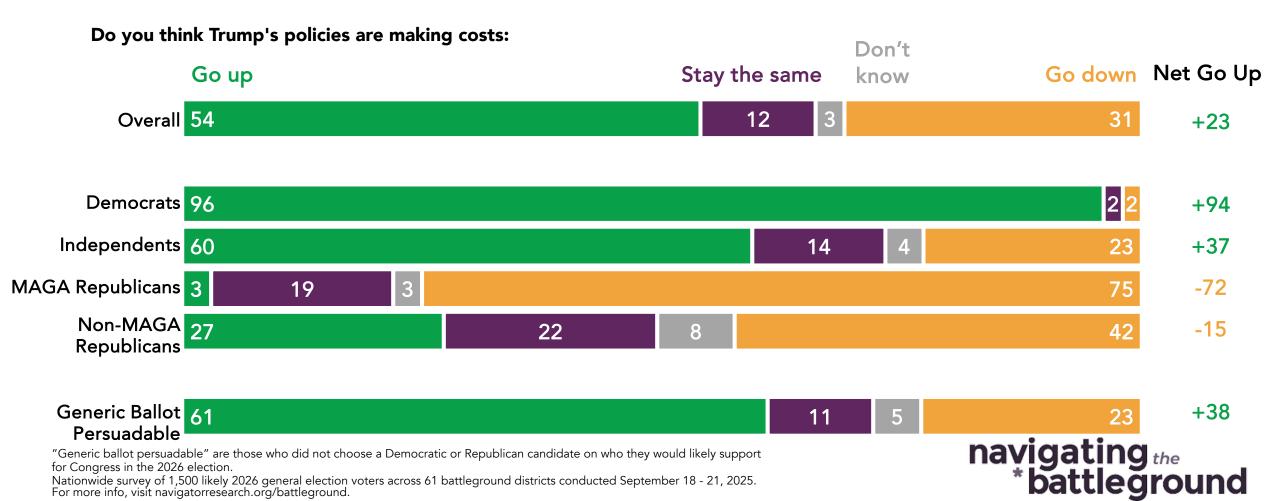
#### **Key Takeaways**

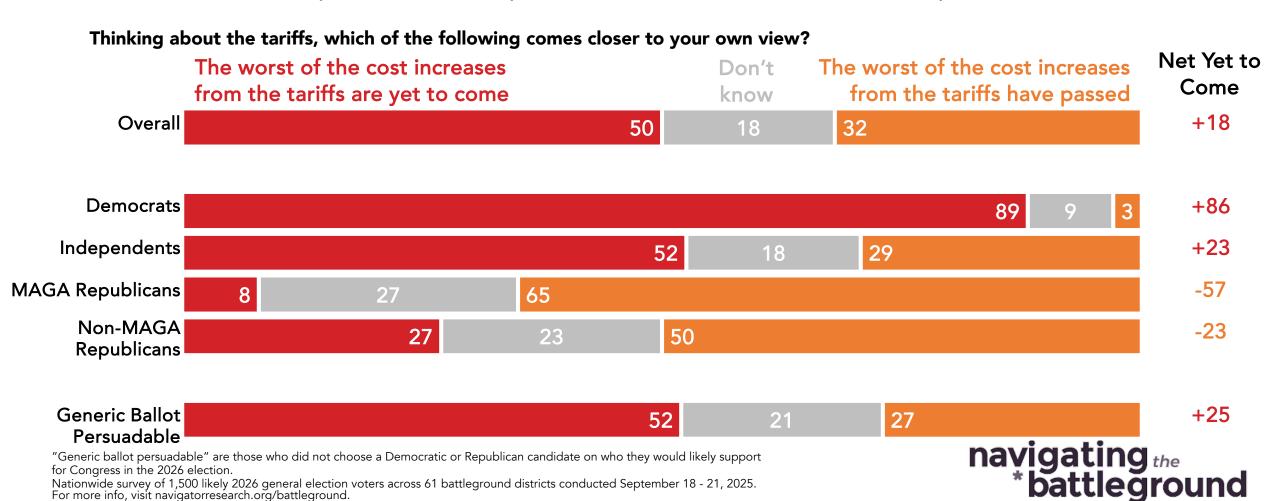
## A Majority Of Battleground Constituents Think Trump's Policies Are Increasing Costs

Six-in-ten Independents believe Trump's policies have caused costs to increase.



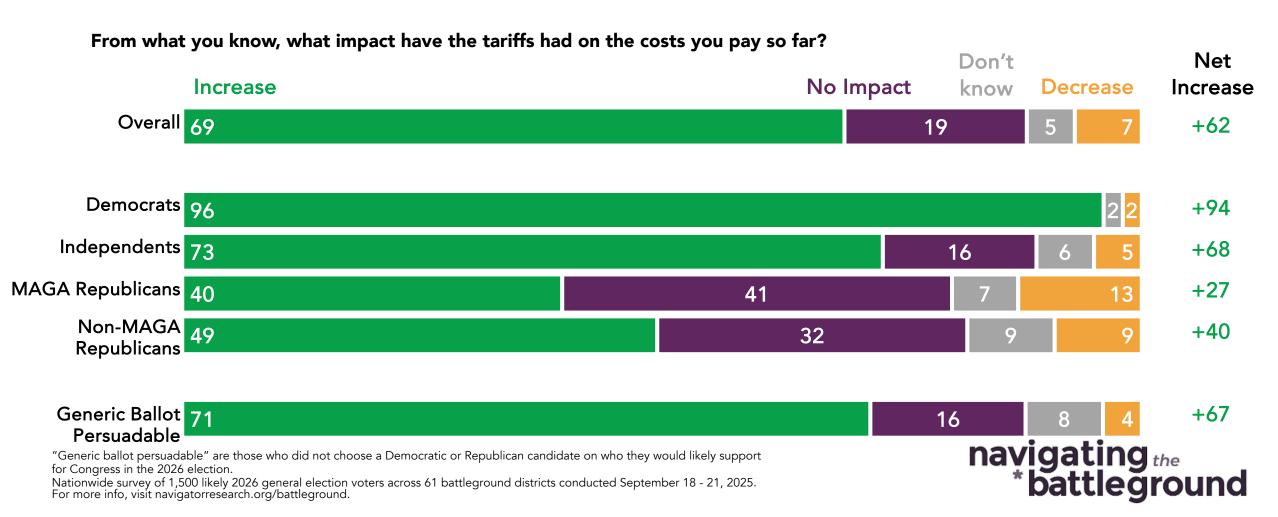
#### A Majority Of Battleground Constituents Think The Worst Of **Cost Increases Is Yet To Come**

This includes a majority of persuadable and Independent voters and nearly 3-in-10 non-MAGA Republicans.



### Nearly 7-in-10 Battleground Constituents Say That Tariffs Have Increased Costs So Far

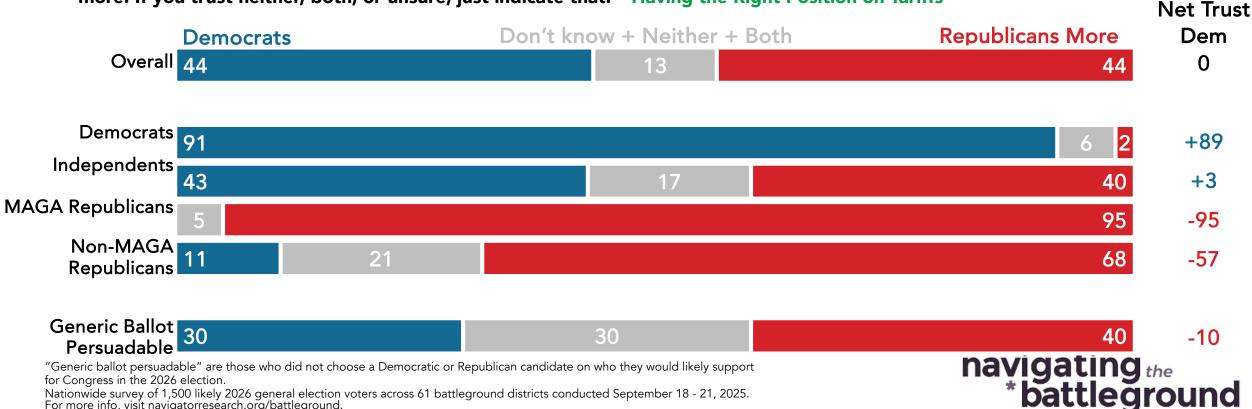
Nearly three-quarters of Independents and 40% of Republicans say the tariffs have increased costs.



#### Neither Party Has An Advantage On Tariffs, Though Independents **Narrowly Trust Democrats**

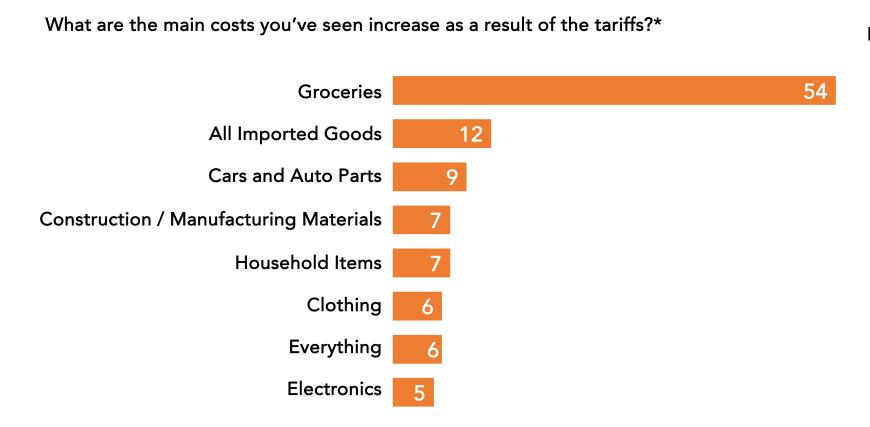
Independents lean towards trusting Democrats more, while persuadable voters lean towards Republicans though 30% don't choose either party

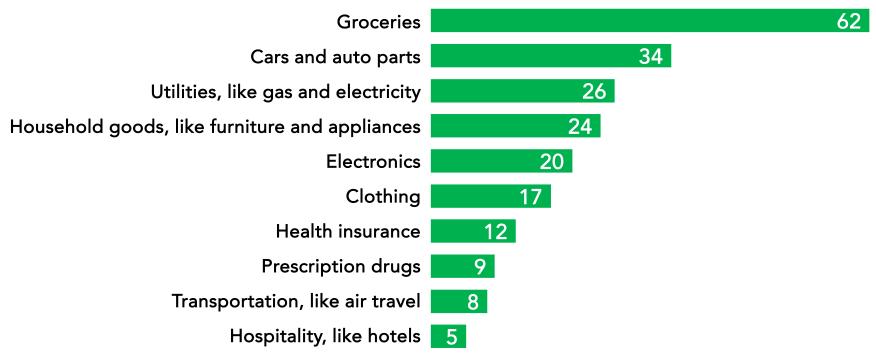

Below is a list of things people spend money on. Please choose the THREE that you think have <u>increased most over the last few months as a result of the tariffs</u>.



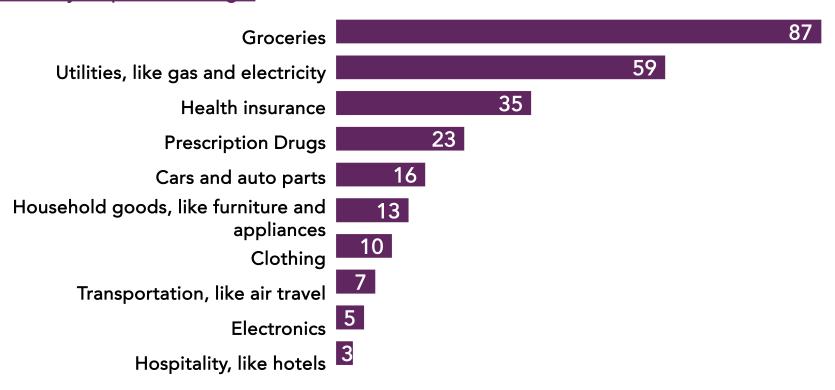

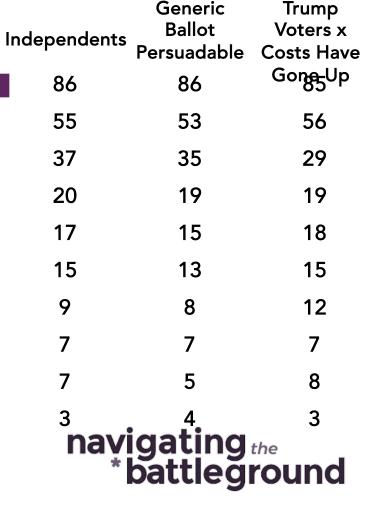

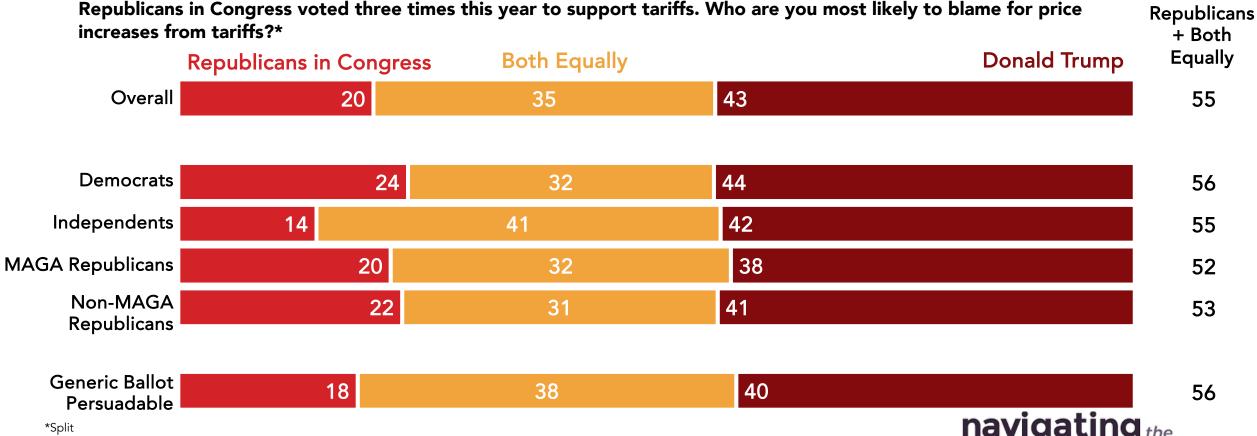

## Battleground Constituents Think Trump Is Most To Blame On Tariffs And About A Third Believe Trump and Republicans Share Equal Blame



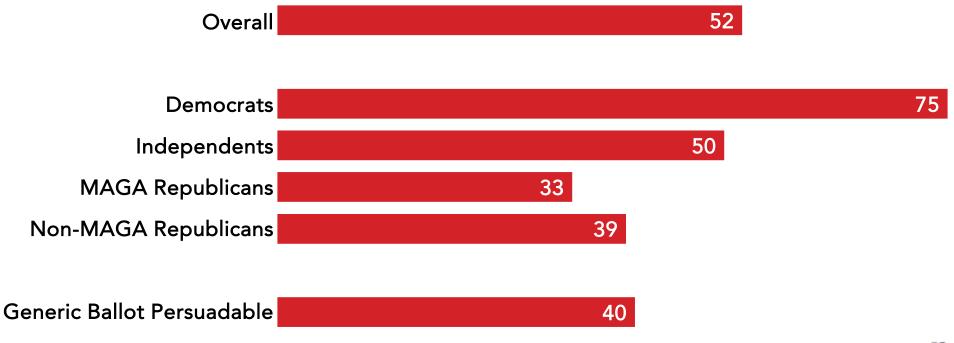

In a world where the news cycle is the length of a tweet, our leaders often lack the real-time public-sentiment analysis to shape the best approaches to talking about the issues that matter the most. **Navigator** is designed to act as a consistent, flexible, responsive tool to inform policy debates by conducting research and reliable guidance to inform allies, elected leaders, and the press. **Navigating the Battleground** is a project designed to understand messaging nuances in different types of battleground geographies, led by pollsters from Impact Research along with an advisory committee, including: Jessica Floyd, The Hub Project; Christina Reynolds, EMILY's List; Mike Podhorzer, AFL-CIO; Jesse Ferguson, progressive strategist; Navin Nayak; Stephanie Valencia, EquisLabs; and Melanie Newman, Planned Parenthood Action Fund.

#### About the Study

Impact Research conducted public opinion surveys among a sample of 1,500 likely 2026 general election voters from September 18–21, 2025. The survey was conducted by text-to-web (100 percent). Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the 61 congressional districts included in the sample across a variety of demographic variables. The margin of error for the full sample at the 95 percent level of confidence is +/- 2.5 percentage points. The margin for error for subgroups varies and is higher.
