Key Takeaways:

- Top concerns for Americans in the shutdown are rising health care costs, an indefinite government shutdown, and the loss of food assistance.
- At the same time, Americans deeply oppose a range of recent financial decisions by the Trump administration, especially new tax cuts for the rich, the bailout of Argentina, and the building of the new White House ballroom.
- A message highlighting wasteful spending from the White House and Republicans in Congress is effective, especially when paired with the context of the government shutdown, as workers don't get paid and millions lose health care coverage or have to pay more in health care costs.
- Half of Americans say the Republican Party is focused on the wrong things at the outset and even more say so after reading information about Trump and Republicans' recent spending.


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Framing Recent Trump Spending With Shutdown Context Drives Up Concerns, Especially Among Republicans



Top Contrasts to Trump's Spending on the Ballroom, Argentina Are Americans Losing Their Jobs, Paychecks, and Health Care

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
Majorities Agree With Democratic Messaging Highlighting Trump and GOP Spending and Health Care Concerns in Shutdown

Expanded independents* and shutdown persuadables** are more compelled by spending arguments than health care – though both work.

[SPENDING] Democrats who say Trump and Republicans are spending billions on foreign aid and conflicts, including a \$40 billion bailout of Argentina and billions more in overseas military spending. Meanwhile, Trump and Republicans are doing nothing for us at home – keeping the government shut down and pushing to strip health care from millions of Americans and raise healthcare costs for millions more

Trump and Republicans who say Democrats have shut down the government and refuse to work together to reopen it. Democrats are unwilling to cut waste, fraud, and abuse from government spending, and instead want to continue to waste taxpayer dollars on healthcare for illegal aliens







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Messaging About Trump/GOP Spending Amid the Shutdown Shifts More to Say the Party Is Focused on the Wrong Things

Non-MAGA Republicans* (from net +41 right things to net +14) and shutdown persuadables** (from net -1 to net -27) shift the most against Republicans on whether they are focused on the right things after learning more about recent spending during the shutdown.

About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted a public opinion survey among a sample of 1,000 registered voters from October 23-October 27, 2025. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables. The margin of error for the full sample at the 95 percent level of confidence is +/- 3.1 percentage points. The margin of error for subgroups varies and is higher.
