
Key Takeaways:

- In the wake of recent events in Minneapolis, including the shootings of Renee Good and Alex Petti by federal agents, Trump's ratings on immigration have declined and ratings of ICE are deeply negative. But, Trump and Republicans remain more trusted on immigration than Democrats.
- Pluralities want to see Kristi Noem impeached and Stephen Miller fired (especially when given context of who he is).
- Americans are divided on abolishing ICE – and when given the option, they prefer significant reforms over abolition or continuing as is. “Fixing” ICE is preferred over “replacement with something else” or abolition on its own.
- Americans most support requiring ICE agents to go through criminal background checks and wear body cameras, though all reforms are supported by a majority of Americans, including setting standards of conduct, requiring de-escalation of conflicts whenever possible, and an ending of racial profiling.

Trump Has Lost Notable Ground on His Handling of Immigration Over the Last Year

Few events in Navigator's tracking have ever risen to the level of awareness that "Trump's deployment of ICE to Minneapolis which led to the fatal shootings of Renee Good and Alex Petti" has, with 83% of Americans hearing "a lot" or "some."

Do you approve or disapprove of the way Donald Trump is handling immigration?





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A Majority of Americans Disapprove of Trump's Handling of Immigration, With Ratings Souring Most Among Independents

Since June, Trump's immigration approval rating has declined by a net 23 points among independents (from net -4 in June to net -27 now).

Do you approve or disapprove of the way Donald Trump is handling immigration?




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ICE's Ratings Are Deeply in the Negative Following Recent Events

Please indicate how favorable or unfavorable you are to: ICE, also known as Immigration and Customs Enforcement.




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While Fewer Trust GOP Now on Immigration, It Doesn't Translate to Greater Trust for Democrats as Many Trust Neither

Please indicate who you personally trust more to handle: Immigration.




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Democrats Are More Trusted on Keeping ICE in Check and Trump/GOP on Border, But One in Five Do Not Trust Either Party

Democrats hold a slight advantage on “ensuring ICE acts within the law” (net +3 trust Democrats more). Americans trust Trump and the Republican Party more to handle enforcing immigration laws, immigration broadly, fixing our immigration system, and border security.

Please indicate who you personally trust more to handle each one.




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Nearly Half Support Impeaching DHS Secretary Kristi Noem

A plurality of non-MAGA Republicans* want to see Noem impeached (40% support). Independents are evenly divided, with 40% not sure.

Do you support or oppose the impeachment of Secretary of Homeland Security Kristi Noem for her role in overseeing ICE operations?




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Americans Want to See Stephen Miller Fired; Support Increases With More Detail About Who He Is and What He's Said

Providing information on Miller drives up support for his firing (from 42% support without background information to 52% with), especially among Republicans (from 29% support without to 40% support with).

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
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
Americans Are Split on Abolishing ICE; When Given More Options, Pluralities Support Reform Over Abolition or Continuation As Is

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
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Background Checks and Body Cameras Are Most Strongly Supported ICE Reforms; Range of Policies Enjoy Majority Support

Net Support



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
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Majorities of Americans Support All ICE Reforms Tested

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About Navigator

In a world where the news cycle is the length of a tweet, our leaders often lack the real-time public-sentiment analysis to shape the best approaches to talking about the issues that matter the most. Navigator is designed to act as a consistent, flexible, responsive tool to inform policy debates by conducting research and reliable guidance to inform allies, elected leaders, and the press. Navigator is a project led by pollsters from Global Strategy Group and GBAO.

About the Study

Global Strategy Group conducted a public opinion survey among a sample of 1,000 registered voters from January 29-February 1, 2026. 100 additional interviews were conducted among Hispanic voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among African American voters. 75 additional interviews were conducted among Asian American and Pacific Islander voters. 100 additional interviews were conducted among independent voters. The survey was conducted online, recruiting respondents from an opt-in online panel vendor. Respondents were verified against a voter file and special care was taken to ensure the demographic composition of our sample matched that of the national registered voter population across a variety of demographic variables. The margin of error for the full sample at the 95 percent level of confidence is +/- 3.1 percentage points. The margin of error for subgroups varies and is higher.
